JESUS IS LORD

- 2:37 Hebrews 1:1ff God spoke to us in the past through the prophets but in these last days through his son. Divine revelation of himself. Bible is NOT the story of man's quest for God (in fact in much of the scripture man is running away from God), but God revealing to us himself. Were it not for him we could know nothing about him. He is not the product of human intellection. God is the great presupposition in scripture not the end product of some philosophical argument. Both Genesis 1 and John 1 begin with the idea of "In the beginning God."
- 13:00 Comparative religions Main difference in Christianity is that it centers on a person vs centering on teachings.
- 17:00 The primary issue is what Jesus said about himself. The 7 "I Am" statements and his claims to be God.
- 21:00 What do you do with his statements about himself (i.e.) John 10:30 "I and the Father are one". What you do with Jesus will define your relationship to God. Jesus is either 1. A Liar. 2. A Lunatic or 3. Who he claimed to be LORD. (The 3 L's argument).

- 25:09 Ephesians 1:9 ff. What is God's will? That all should be united in Jesus the Christ.
- 32:35 Hebrews 2:8 Everything under his control even though it might not seem so.
- 33:35 Colossians 1:15 Image of the invisible God, all things created through him and for him.
 - 39:38 All the fullness of Deity dwells in him.
 - 42:15 Where do you stand on Jesus?
- 49:00 We glorify the Father by exalting Jesus. So also does the Holy Spirit exalt Jesus.

- Heb. 1:1 In many and various ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets; 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. 3 He reflects the glory of God and bears the very stamp of his nature, upholding the universe by his word of power. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,
- Gen. 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.
- <u>John 1:1</u> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- <u>John 6:35</u> Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst.
- John 8:12 Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."
- <u>John 10:7</u> So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep.
- John 10:11 I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.
- John 11:25 Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live,
- <u>John 14:6</u> Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me.
- John 15:1 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser.
- John 10:30 I and the Father are one."
- Eph. 1:9 For he has made known to us in all wisdom and insight the mystery of his will, according to his purpose which he set forth in Christ $\underline{10}$ as a plan for the fulness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

<u>Heb. 2:8</u> putting everything in subjection under his feet." Now in putting everything in subjection to him, he left nothing outside his control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to him.
