The Messenger:

3:50 A teaching on a Messenger, a Message, and a Listener (Hearer).

4:40 Romans 10:12-17 The Messenger brings the Good News.

8:50 Matthew 28: 19-20 & Mark 16:15 - The call to go into the world with the Good News.

13:30 A sermon should be a word about the word (scripture) about the WORD (Jesus).

16:30 2 Chronicles 15:3 "For a long time Israel was without the true God, and without a teaching priest, and without the law."

18:20 Malachi 2:7 There needs to be anointed messengers who speak the word of the Lord almighty, and men should be drawn to seek understanding.

The Message:

21:00 Isaiah 55:10-11 The word (Word) shall go out and not return empty. When the Gospel is really preached it will yield a fruitful crop.

26:00 The Gospel message is one of good news – God has removed the wall of separation, and calls upon all to come into his family and fellowship.

The Listener – Hearers:

27:00 Mark 4:1-20, Matthew 13:1-23, Luke 8:4-15. The parable of the sower. What kind of listener are we? Read the passage from Mark. The parable could easily be named the parable of soils – it is our job to keep our soil prepared (fertilized and watered) so that when the seed is sown it produces a bountiful crop.

37:50 Hebrews 4:2 If the hearers of the gospel are absent of faith then it will not have fruitful value. As with Nicodemus in John 3:3, you must be born again to take in the richness of the life in the Spirit.

39:20 Musical tone A440 – make sure your are tuned in properly.

Rom. 10:12 For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, 13 for, “Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

Rom. 10:14 How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? 15 And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!”

Rom. 10:16 But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, “Lord, who has believed our message?” 17 Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ.

Matt. 28:19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”

Mark 16:15 He said to them, “Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation.

2Chr. 15:3 For a long time Israel was without the true God, without a priest to teach and without the law.

Mal. 2:7 “For the lips of a priest ought to preserve knowledge, and from his mouth men should seek instruction—because he is the messenger of the LORD Almighty.

Is. 55:10 As the rain and the snow
come down from heaven,
and do not return to it
without watering the earth
and making it bud and flourish,
so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater,
11 so is my word that goes out from my mouth:
It will not return to me empty,

but will accomplish what I desire
and achieve the purpose for which I sent it.

Mark 4:1 Again Jesus began to teach by the lake. The crowd that gathered around him was so large that he got into a boat and sat in it out on the lake, while all the people were along the shore at the water's edge. 2 He taught them many things by parables, and in his teaching said: 3 "Listen! A farmer went out to sow his seed. 4 As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. 5 Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. 6 But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. 7 Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants, so that they did not bear grain. 8 Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, multiplying thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times."

Mark 4:9 Then Jesus said, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Mark 4:10 When he was alone, the Twelve and the others around him asked him about the parables. 11 He told them, "The secret of the kingdom of God has been given to you. But to those on the outside everything is said in parables 12 so that,

" 'they may be ever seeing but never perceiving,
and ever hearing but never understanding;
otherwise they might turn and be forgiven!'"

Mark 4:13 Then Jesus said to them, "Don't you understand this parable? 14 The farmer sows the word. 15 Some people are like seed along the path, where the word is sown. As soon as they hear it, Satan comes and takes away the word that was sown in them. 16 Others, like seed sown on rocky places, hear the word and at once receive it with joy. 17 But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. 18 Still others, like seed sown among thorns, hear the word; 19 but the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth and the desires for other things come in and choke the word, making it unfruitful. 20 Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop—thirty, sixty or even a

hundred times what was sown.”

Heb. 4:2 For we also have had the gospel preached to us, just as they did; but the message they heard was of no value to them, because those who heard did not combine it with faith.

John 3:3 In reply Jesus declared, “I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again.”
