THY KINGDOM COME

Terry traces the references to the Kingdom and the King throughout the scripture. A brief outline follows:

Genesis 1 and 2. The Lord establishes that man will have a responsibility on earth. There will be a sphere of authority under which he will act (boundaries as in the forbidden tree).

20:40 Genesis 3:15 The Proto Evangelion. (1) There will come a Human – the seed of the woman, who will be at enmity with the evil one.

23:10 Genesis 12:1-3 (2) The Abrahamic Covenant. One of Abraham's descendants will bring blessing to the world.

25:50 Genesis 49:10 (3) That descendant will come from the line of Judah and shall have kingly power and the scepter will not depart.

27:20 1 Chronicles 17 (4) Continuing in the line of Judah through David there shall come one who God will designate His Son and he shall reign over God's kingdom forever.

31:15 Isaiah 9:6-7 (5) He shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace and HE shall reign forever.

35:10 Micah 5:2 (6) He shall come from Bethlehem Ephrathah. (There were two Bethlehems at the time, but this was specific)

37:35 Daniel 2:1-45 (7) The one who will be the King forever and over God's kingdom will physically enter the world during the time of the Roman empire. This kingdom shall never pass to another.

50:45 Luke 1:26-38 (8) The seed of the woman, whose name is Jesus, coming from David's line (Judah), will be called the Son of God and he will rule God's kingdom forever.

Therefore, come into the Kingdom ! Hallelujah !

Gen. 1:26 Then God said, ^O“Let us make man^{*} in our image, ^Pafter our likeness. And ^Qlet them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over the livestock and over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.”

Gen. 1:27 So God created man in his own image,
in the image of God he created him;
^rmale and female he created them.

Gen. 1:28 And God blessed them. And God said to them, ^S“Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth.”

Gen. 2:15 The LORD God took the man ^kand put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it. 16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, “You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, 17 but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil ^lyou shall not eat, for in the day that you eat^{*} of it you ^mshall surely die.”

Gen. 3:1 Now ^Uthe serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made.

He said to the woman, “Did God actually say, ‘You^{*} shall not eat of any tree in the garden?’” 2 And the woman said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, 3 but God said, ^V‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die.’”
4 ^WBut the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. 5 For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.” 6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise,^{*} she took of its fruit ^Xand ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, ^Yand he ate. 7 ^ZThen the eyes of both were opened, ^aand they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths.

Gen. 12:1 Now mthe LORD said* to Abram, “Go from your country* and your kindred and your father’s house to the land that I will show you. 2 nAnd I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. 3 oI will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and Pin you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.”*

Gen. 49:10 The mscepter shall not depart from Judah,
nor the ruler’s staff nfrom between his feet,
until tribute comes to him;*
and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples.
