7:50 The doctrine of the Trinity is man's reflection on what God has revealed about his personhood and essence.

Rather than go into a long theological study of the arguments for the Trinity Terry decides to take his listeners on a journey. The journey is one taken from the eyes and mind of a Jewish contemporary of Jesus.

40:30 The Holy Spirit is best apprehended as God – Jesus in the now. Terry expresses concern that too many Christians are stuck in a Sunday school mentality when it comes to understanding God and his revelation to man. That is the reason that many think they have outgrown God. They have intellectually matured through life yet their image of God is locked in a childhood frame.

- <u>John 1:1</u> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. $\underline{2}$ He was with God in the beginning.
- John 1:3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of men. 5 The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.
- John 1:6 There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. 8 He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. 9 The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world.
- John 1:10 He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. 11 He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. 12 Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—13 children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.
- <u>John 1:14</u> The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- John 1:15 John testifies concerning him. He cries out, saying, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me." 16 From the fullness of his grace we have all received one blessing after another. 17 For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. 18 No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, who is at the Father's side, has made him known.
- John 20:22 And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit.
