OUR LORD

1:55 Hebrews 1:1-3 Our God is a God who has spoken and still speaks. In former days through the prophets, but in these last days through his Son.

2:20 There are 3294 questions posed in the King James version of the bible – 2272 in the Old Testament and 1022 in the New Testament. The two most important questions are expressed in Acts 22: 8 & 10 “Who are you Lord”? and “What would you have me do”?

Who are you Lord:

10:00 John 1:1-14 In the beginning was the Word (Our God speaks), The Word was with the Father (Plurality), The Word was God (Unity). He became flesh and made his dwelling among us (verse 14).

13:30 There are other religions but none of them are like Christianity. They focus on their teachings, but Christianity focuses on a person – Jesus the Christ.

21:00 Jesus distinction from all others is manifested in the statements he made about himself. He claimed to be God. You only have 3 responses to his claims – 1. He was a liar, 2. He was a Lunatic or 3. He was and is Lord as he claimed.

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24:50 Ephesians 1:9-10 Is there a purpose and meaning to the universe? God expresses the answer in verses 9 and 10.

34:00 Colossians 1:15-20 Jesus is the image of the invisible God, completely supreme over all things and in him all the fullness of God resides. Jesus is not 1/3 of God.

43:50 Philippians 2:5-11 Jesus came to serve, yet he is King of Kings and Lord of Lords. God the Father exalted him above all things and we can glorify the Father by exalting the Son (verse 11).

55:00 One of the problems with much of the church at present, is the tendency on a functional level to consider the Godhead Unitarian rather than Trinitarian. We talk of "God" or "Lord" or sometimes "Christ" but many are reluctant to take the name of Jesus upon their lips.

57:00 Daniel 7:13-14 Daniel sees the final answer in God's purpose.

58:00 Revelation 5:11-14 John sees in the vision the same understanding that Daniel had.

61:00 Now that it is established that Jesus is Lord and He has sent us a counselor (Holy Spirit) to guide our ways – it behooves us to look to the 2nd most important question - What would you have me Do Lord ? (Acts 22:10). If Jesus is really the Lord (Boss) in life, then we had better yield to him if we are to find God's daily Grace in our lives.

Heb. 1:1 In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. 3 The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven.

Acts 22:8 “ ‘Who are you, Lord?’ I asked.

“ ‘I am Jesus of Nazareth, whom you are persecuting,’ he replied.

Acts 22:10 “ ‘What shall I do, Lord?’ I asked.

“ ‘Get up,’ the Lord said, ‘and go into Damascus. There you will be told all that you have been assigned to do.’

John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning.

John 1:3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of men. 5 The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.

John 1:6 There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. 8 He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. 9 The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world.

John 1:10 He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. 11 He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. 12 Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— 13 children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have

seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Eph. 1:9 And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, 10 to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment—to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.

Col. 1:15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. 16 For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him. 17 He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. 18 And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. 19 For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, 20 and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

Phil. 2:5 Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:

Phil. 2:6 Who, being in very nature God,
did not consider equality with God something to be grasped,
7 but made himself nothing,
taking the very nature of a servant,
being made in human likeness.

Phil. 2:8 And being found in appearance as a man,
he humbled himself
and became obedient to death—
even death on a cross!

Phil. 2:9 Therefore God exalted him to the highest place
and gave him the name that is above every name,
10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,
in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.

Dan. 7:13 “In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. 14 He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all peoples, nations and men of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

Rev. 5:11 Then I looked and heard the voice of many angels, numbering thousands upon thousands, and ten thousand times ten thousand. They encircled the throne and the living creatures and the elders. 12 In a loud voice they sang:

“Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain,
to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength
and honor and glory and praise!”

Rev. 5:13 Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and on the sea, and all that is in them, singing:

“To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb
be praise and honor and glory and power,
for ever and ever!”

14 The four living creatures said, “Amen,” and the elders fell down and worshiped.
