## # 901220-5 HE WAS CONCEIVED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

- 3:30 The Birth of Jesus although greatly celebrated today was not much of a topic in the early church. Paul who wrote 13 of the New Testament books, all before the Gospel accounts were written, never wrote about the Birth. Only two of the Gospel writers mention it; Matthew and Luke. The birth is not nearly so significant as the life that follows.
- 6:50 Matthew 1:18-19 Terry clarifies the seeming inconsistency between verse 18 referring to Mary as "pledged to be married" and verse 19 which calls Joseph her husband and mentions that he thought about divorce; which seems to indicate that they were already married.
- 23:00 Isaiah 7:14 Terry clarifies the Hebrew words for young women and virgin and the transliteration to Greek.
- 43:40 The beginning of a teaching on Mary as one who was in God's favor.
- 01:03:00 A continuation on the teaching of the veneration of Mary, and the Roman Catholic doctrine of the Immaculate Conception".
- 01:21:50 Luke 1:38 Mary's response to the visiting angel: "I am the Lord's servant, Mary answered. May it be to me as you have said".

That would be a good response for us after our encounters with the Holy Spirit. Hopefully we recognize the encounters.

- Matt. 1:18 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. 19 Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.
- <u>Is. 7:14</u> Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.
- <u>Luke 1:38</u> "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May it be to me as you have said." Then the angel left her.
