910321-5 I BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

2:00 The Apostles Creed and the Nicene Creed are succinct statements of the spiritual truths found in scripture.

4:30 The term “I believe IN” is a statement of relationship. It differs from a statement that says I believe THAT, which implies just an intellectual accent to an idea.

9:20 The Holy Spirit is “God in the now”

12:00 In this section of the creed beginning with the Holy Spirit you also find statements about the Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins and the resurrection of the body. Terry explains the reasons why those elements are in the section on the Holy Spirit and the appropriate scripture references.

13:00 1 Corinthians 12:13; (15:00) 2 Corinthians 13:14; (16:30) John 16:8; Romans 8:11.

22:00 “I believe in the Holy Spirit”. Terry takes a journey through the appropriate passages on the presence, reception of, and the impact of the Holy Spirit in the lives of Christians.

41:30 John 14:16-18 Jesus promises the sending of the
Holy Spirit. He uses the phrase (Verse 18) „I will come to you.

42:30 Ezekiel 36:26-27 Old Testament prophecy that the
day is coming when God will put his Spirit in his people.

44:40 John 14:26 Christians are to be an instructed
people.

45:30 1 John 2:26-27 When you hear teachings you need
to discern whether they are true. The Spirit will lead you if you
are in tune with Him.

47:45 John 16:7-11 Jesus going away and the Spirit will
come and convict men of their sin and need to repent.

51:30 John 16:12-13 The Holy Spirit will guide you.

52:00 Romans 8:14-17 Spirit of Son-ship. Galatians 4:4-
7, a relationship meant to be so intimate that you can feel as if
he is your Daddy.

01:02:30 Romans 15:13 Hope, Joy and Peace by the
power of the Holy Spirit.

1Cor. 12:13 For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.

2Cor. 13:14 May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

John 16:8 When he comes, he will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment:

Rom. 8:11 And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit, who lives in you.

John 3:1 Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish ruling council. 2 He came to Jesus at night and said, “Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous signs you are doing if God were not with him.”

John 3:3 In reply Jesus declared, “I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again.”

John 3:4 “How can a man be born when he is old?” Nicodemus asked. “Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother’s womb to be born!”

John 3:5 Jesus answered, “I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. 6 Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. 7 You should not be surprised at my saying, ‘You must be born again.’ 8 The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.”

John 4:24 God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth.”

John 3:8 The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.”

John 4:9 The Samaritan woman said to him, “You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?” (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.)

John 4:10 Jesus answered her, “If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water.”

John 7:37 On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, “If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. 38 Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him.” 39 By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.

John 14:16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever— 17 the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. 18 I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you.

Ezek. 36:26 I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. 27 And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws.

John 14:26 But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

1John 2:26 I am writing these things to you about those who are trying to lead you astray. 27 As for you, the anointing you received from him remains in you, and you do not need anyone to teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about all things and as that anointing is real, not counterfeit—just as it has taught you, remain in him.

John 16:7 But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. 8 When he comes, he will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin

and righteousness and judgment: 9 in regard to sin, because men do not believe in me; 10 in regard to righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; 11 and in regard to judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned.

John 16:12 “I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. 13 But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come.

Rom. 8:14 because those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. 15 For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, “*Abba*, Father.” 16 The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God’s children. 17 Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

Gal. 4:4 But when the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, 5 to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons. 6 Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, “*Abba*, Father.” 7 So you are no longer a slave, but a son; and since you are a son, God has made you also an heir.

Rom. 15:13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.
