### THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS

7:20 Communion: The meaning in the context of the New Testament. Greek word – Koinonia – meaning togetherness for a purpose. It is intentional and there is a commitment to one another in the fellowship.

15:20 Acts 2:42 ...They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and to the fellowship. Acts 4:32 ..One heart and mind..

33:00 Saints: The Greek word is – Hagios – In the New Testament it refers to all the believers. The whole body of Christ.

49:15 1 John 1:3 Fellowship with one another and fellowship with the Father and the Son.

50:00 1 John 1:5-7 Our fellowship is to be in the light – No hypocrisy – then the blood of Jesus purifies us from all sin.

53:00 2 Corinthians 5:11-21 God has reconciled to us and if we have reconciled ourselves to Him then we are to be His ambassadors to reconcile those who are yet without Him. Bring them into the communion (fellowship) of the Saints.

Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

Acts 4:32 All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had.

1John 1:3 We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. 4 We write this to make our joy complete.

1John 1:5 This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. 6 If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

2Cor. 5:11 Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord, we try to persuade men. What we are is plain to God, and I hope it is also plain to your conscience. 12 We are not trying to commend ourselves to you again, but are giving you an opportunity to take pride in us, so that you can answer those who take pride in what is seen rather than in what is in the heart. 13 If we are out of our mind, it is for the sake of God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. 14 For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. 15 And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

2Cor. 5:16 So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! 18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: 19 that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. 20 We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. 21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

2Cor. 13:14        May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God,  
and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
