15-186-6 CULTIVATING A GODLY MEMORY

:00 – 7:00 Terry teaches on his understanding of the importance of memory in relationship to knowing your identity. In the Christian life we need to know from where we have come to know where we are supposed to go.

7:15 Isaiah 46:8 Remember this, Fix it in your mind, and take it to heart.

8:00 Terry makes the challenging assertion that one can be saved in a sense and not be a Christian in full. To be a Christian one has to understand from whence they came and their position in reference to the Body of Christ.

11:00 Deuteronomy 5:15 (To the Israelites) Remember who you were – A slave in a foreign land and now you are delivered from bondage.

14:00 Exodus 19:4 The concept of the Exodus is repeated throughout the scripture and it has two foci. 1. Man finds himself in one state of affairs and 2. God rescues him and brings him into another state and identity.

15:45 Deuteronomy 16:1-3 Terry teaches that the Lord asked the Israelites to remember three overriding concepts. 1. Remember where you were and how you were rescued. 2. Remember the celebratory feast that commemorates your deliverance. 3. Remember that you are a child of God and that you are to teach the concepts to your children so that succeeding generations will be active in the family of God.

Remember the day you stood before the Lord – Deuteronomy 4:10

22:00 Ephesians 2:11 “Therefore remember”. An admonition in the New Testament to the Christians on the importance of Godly memory. 1. You were once Gentiles, separated from Christ. 2. Excluded from Citizenship in God’s family. 3. You were Foreigners to the covenants of promise. 4. You were without Hope. 5. You were without God in your world.

27:00 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 The remembrance of the New Covenant Commemorative feast.

29:50 You don’t become a Christian by being saved, you become a Christian by understanding your place in the family of God and responding to your responsibility.

31:20 We can’t be lone Christians. We need to be active within the Body to fully Know Christ and to be prepared to make Christ known. As the Lord instructed the Israelites to pass it on, we too must be able to pass it on. The church is one generation from extinction if we don’t pass along the Gospel message and the relationship.

33:00 Jude 5 and 17-19 Though you already know this I want to remind you. The Lord delivered them out of Egypt but later destroyed those who did not believe. There will be scoffers in these last days.

35:40 2 Peter 1:12 I remind you of these things even though you know them. Even though God has preserved us many times we often continue to forget his Faithful Grace when we face new difficulties.

Is. 46:8 “Remember this, fix it in mind,
take it to heart, you rebels.

Deut. 5:15 Remember that you were slaves in Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out of there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God has commanded you to observe the Sabbath day.

Ex. 19:4 ‘You yourselves have seen what I did to Egypt, and how I carried you on eagles’ wings and brought you to myself.

Deut. 16:1 Observe the month of Abib and celebrate the Passover of the LORD your God, because in the month of Abib he brought you out of Egypt by night. 2 Sacrifice as the Passover to the LORD your God an animal from your flock or herd at the place the LORD will choose as a dwelling for his Name. 3 Do not eat it with bread made with yeast, but for seven days eat unleavened bread, the bread of affliction, because you left Egypt in haste—so that all the days of your life you may remember the time of your departure from Egypt.

Deut. 4:10 Remember the day you stood before the LORD your God at Horeb, when he said to me, “Assemble the people before me to hear my words so that they may learn to revere me as long as they live in the land and may teach them to their children.”

Eph. 2:11 Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called “uncircumcised” by those who call themselves “the circumcision” (that done in the body by the hands of men)—

1Cor. 11:23 For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, 24 and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, “**This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.**” 25 In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, “**This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.**” 26 For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

Jude 5 Though you already know all this, I want to remind you that the Lord

delivered his people out of Egypt, but later destroyed those who did not believe.

Jude 17 But, dear friends, remember what the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ foretold. 18 They said to you, “In the last times there will be scoffers who will follow their own ungodly desires.” 19 These are the men who divide you, who follow mere natural instincts and do not have the Spirit.

2Pet. 1:12 So I will always remind you of these things, even though you know them and are firmly established in the truth you now have.
