17-131-7 DOING WHAT IS RIGHT IN YOUR OWN EYES

- :50 Judges 21:25 The last verse in the book of Judges "In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes."
- 2:20 One consequence of disobedience to the Lord was that the Israelites were made to be slaves again; but this time not in Egypt, but in their own "promised" land.
- 4:30 When there is no sense of a leader then everyone becomes their own leader.
- 5:00-9:00 The treachery of deception, to do your own thing. Genesis 3 and John 8:44. The question becomes Does God have the right to set the parameters of our life? Is He sovereign over us or not?
- 11:00 1 John 2:16-17 "For everything in the world the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does comes not from the Father but from the world".

Teaching on the word "Lust" (Greek – Epithymia) and its use. It means strong desire, and is applied to several passages. In Luke 22:15 The word used is eagerly or sometimes earnestly. In James 1:14 – "but each one is tempted when, by his own evil desire (Epithymia).

- 23:30 Proverbs 16:25 There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death.
- 24:40 Proverbs 3:5-7 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil.

- Judg. 21:25 In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as he saw fit.
- Gen. 3:1 Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?"
- Gen. 3:2 The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, 3 but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'"
- Gen. 3:4 "You will not surely die," the serpent said to the woman. 5 "For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."
- Gen. 3:6 When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye, and also desirable for gaining wisdom, she took some and ate it. She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. 7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves.
- Gen. 3:8 Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?"
- Gen. 3:10 He answered, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid."
- Gen. 3:11 And he said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from?"
- Gen. 3:12 The man said, "The woman you put here with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it."
- Gen. 3:13 Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?"

The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

- Gen. 3:14 So the LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, "Cursed are you above all the livestock and all the wild animals!

 You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life.
- Gen. 3:15 And I will put enmity
 between you and the woman,
 and between your offspring and hers;
 he will crush your head,
 and you will strike his heel."
