## HOW LONG WILL YOU GO LIMPING WITH DIFFERENT OPINIONS

- 1:40 1 Kings 18:20-21 How long will you go limping between two different opinions? The question is relevant to the Sovereignty under which a person sees himself.
- 2:20 Colossians 1:13 God has delivered us from a kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of his Son. Jesus' primary theme in his teaching centered on the Kingdom –which is that state of affairs where the will and purpose of God is carried out in the hearts and actions of man. See the Lord's Prayer.
- 8:15 Matthew 4:1-11 The Temptation of Jesus. Although many Christians are fascinated by the thought of Satan, Terry teaches that it is wrong to over emphasize Satan's presence as he is a vanquished foe and he knows it.
- 10:15 1 John 3:8 ..." The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work". Did Jesus succeed? Terry answers.
- 13:00 Hebrews 2:14 ..... he came to destroy him who holds the power of death that is, the devil...
- Terry Therefore, as Christians we should never view our life from Satan's perspective, but from God's.
  - 16:45 James 1:13-15 Teaching on Temptation.

19:40 James 1:2-4 Teaching on distinctions of testing, trials and temptations and the source of them. Are you looking at them from Satan's perspective or God's perspective?

26:40 1 Corinthians 10:13 Temptation is common and not unique to you alone. God will provide a way for you to avoid letting the temptation lead to sin. God also maintains control over the severity of the temptation, trial etc. Teaching on Job to make the point.

Keep the focus on the Sovereignty of our Lord and dismiss the idea that Satan has rule over your life.

1Kings 18:20 So Ahab sent to all the people of Israel, and gathered the prophets together at Mount Carmel. 21 And Elijah came near to all the people, and said, "How long will you go limping with two different opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal, then follow him." And the people did not answer him a word.

<u>Col. 1:13</u> He has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son,

Matt. 4:1 Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. 2 And he fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterward he was hungry. 3 And the tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." 4 But he answered, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." 5 Then the devil took him to the holy city, and set him on the pinnacle of the temple, 6 and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down; for it is written, 'He will give his angels charge of you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone." 7 Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'You shall not tempt the Lord your God." 8 Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and the glory of them; 9 and he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." 10 Then Jesus said to him, "Begone, Satan! for it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve." 11 Then the devil left him, and behold, angels came and ministered to him.

1John 3:8 He who commits sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.

Heb. 2:14 Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same nature, that through death he might destroy him who has the power of death, that is, the devil,

James 1:13 Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted with evil and he himself tempts no one; 14 but each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. 15 Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin; and sin when it is full-grown brings

forth death.

<u>James 1:2</u> Count it all joy, my brethren, when you meet various trials, <u>3</u> for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. <u>4</u> And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

1Cor. 10:13 No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.
