Question 1 : Who are you Lord?

Terry gave these messages to St. Mark's church, Palm Beach Gardens, Florida in January 1991.

1:00 There are 3294 questions in the King James version of the bible. 2,272 questions in the Old Testament and 1,022 questions in the New Testament. Teaching on the two most important questions that anybody could ever ask at anytime at anyplace. Setting the context for the asking of these questions.

3:00 Acts 22:8 Lord who are you ? The answer to the question sets you up, to either understand the Christian faith, or not to understand it.

5:05 Hebrews 1:1 In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, Teaching

9:20 Hebrews 1:2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. God changes the way he reveals himself to his people.

10:05 Genesis 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.

Teaching. God's Word to us is a person! A reality totally different than any other religion. The essence of Christianity is in the person of Jesus. Who are you Lord? A synopsis of some, of the Old Testament prophecy concerning the Coming One. Reference Isaiah 9:6; Micah 5:2.

18:40 Ephesians 1:9-10 And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, 10 to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment—to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.

Teaching. The purpose of God is centered in Jesus Christ. His plan stretches from creation to consummation. God's announced purpose: to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.

21:20 Ephesians 1:20-23 Jesus is far above all in authority, rule, power and dominion for all eternity.

24:30 Colossians 1:15 Jesus is the image of the invisible God. Reference John 14:9 Jesus said - He who has seen me has seen the Father. Reference John 10:30 "I and the Father are one."

25:05 Colossians 1:16 Jesus was from before creation. Reference John 1:1-3 (3) Through him all things were made. The truth is: We exist for Jesus' sake, not that he exists for our sake. If we choose to live our life without reference to Jesus, we miss the whole reason as to why we are here. Lord who are you?

26:50 Colossians 1:17 He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. Teaching – creation, universe.

27:40 Colossians 1:18 And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. Jesus is the only head of the church. Teaching.

30:40 Colossians 1:19 For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, Reference Colossians 2:9 For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form,

31:40 Philippians 2:5-11 Teaching on the deity of Christ and his headship. The way to glorify the Father is to exalt Jesus.

37:20 Teaching – God lacks nothing. He is full in the plenitude of his own being. He needs nothing. So we serve him by serving one another in his name. Reference Matthew 25:34-40.

38:30 John 5:22-23 Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son, 23 that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him. Reference John 14:6 Jesus answered, “I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

Jesus the Christ, is God in the flesh.

40:40 If Jesus is exalted so much then what about the Holy Spirit? Reference John 16:13-14 The Holy Spirit will bring glory to Jesus. Reference Matthew 16:13-17

42:00 Daniel 7:13-14 Daniel has a vision of the coming Christ.

44:00 Revelation 5:11-14 They fell down and worshiped.

45:00 Acts 22:8 The most important question anyone could ever ask at anytime:

“ ‘Who are you, Lord?’ I asked.

“ ‘I am Jesus of Nazareth, whom you are persecuting,’ he replied.

45:15 Acts 22:10 The second most important question anyone could ever ask at anytime:

‘What shall I do, Lord?’ I asked.

Teaching - Introduction to the next evening's message on the connection between Who are you Lord? And What will you have me do?

If you have never asked the second question then you do not understand the answer to the first question, nor your relationship to God.
