910126-11 LIFE'S TWO MOST IMPORTANT QUESTIONS Question 2 : What shall I do LORD?

Terry gave these messages to St. Mark's Church, Palm Beach Gardens, Florida in January 1991.

1:15 Acts 22:6-8 "About noon as I came near Damascus, suddenly a bright light from heaven flashed around me. 7 I fell to the ground and heard a voice say to me, 'Saul! Saul! Why do you persecute me?'

2:15 Teaching – Jesus spoke of himself in his authority as God. A few examples:

Matthew 11:28 Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest

John 6: 51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

- 14:30 Teaching on the nature of good works as expressed in Ephesians 2:10. Three effects or characteristics of good works.
 - 1. They bring personal fulfillment. (Most people do not live fulfilled lives, always seeking never finding).
 - 2. They bring blessing to other people.
 - 3. They bring glory to God.
 - 16:00 Matthew 5:16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven. Teaching In God's eyes, our destiny is to bring glory to him.

- 33:30 Teaching begins on how God equips us. Two primary ways. 1. Through the natural gifting God has given to us. 2. Through the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

33:50 Matthew 25:14-30 God has given to us the talents we need to accomplish his purpose. We are to utilize those loaned talents to further his will. God does not anoint institutions or programs, he anoints people. He anoints the natural gifting he has already given them.

47:50 Teaching on ministry. What we need to do to have a ministry is to release our gifts to the Lord and offer them to his purpose. Yieldedness to the purpose of God is the place of power and the place of peace.

1:00:40 Philippians 4:7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Teaching – The peace that passes understanding is found on the path of God's purpose for you and nowhere else.

The fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, Peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control only grow in the garden of obedience.

Our willfulness stands in the way of God's purpose for us.
