MAKING GOD A LIAR

1:10 1 John 1:10 If we say that we have not sinned, we make God a liar, and his word is not in us. Reference 1 John 1:5 God is light.

2:00 James 1:17 In God there is no shadow. Reference 1 John 1:6 If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. Reference 1 John 1:7 If we walk in the light, the blood of Jesus cleanses us.

2:45 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. A conditional promise (If -Then). Reference Deuteronomy 4:29 The derivation of the word confess comes from two Latin words which mean "To say along together with". Teaching on the conviction of Sin by the Holy Spirit as distinguished from condemnation.

5:25 Romans 8:1 No condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Condemnation is the work of the evil one. Teaching on broken fellowship with God vs. broken relationship.

8:40 Teaching on the various Greek words which are translated "Sin" in English.

Harmartia – G266 – A missing of the mark. A reference to Leviticus 20:7-8 Be Holy because I am Holy.

Parabasis - G3847 – Deliberately stepping over the line – Trespassing. Intentional

Paraptoma – G3900 - Sliding across the line – unintentional. i.e. manslaughter vs. murder.

Anomia – G458 – Without law. Lawlessness – doing your own thing. No restraints.

Opheilema –G3783 – Owing a debt, not repaid. We are in a position of debt to God for what he has done for us. We need to recognize that debt.

16:47 Isaiah 64:6 Even our righteous deeds are like a filthy garment.

17:25 1 John 1:9 If we confess, he forgives and cleanses. If we try and hide our sin from God it stops the forgiveness.

18:05 1 John 5:10 He who believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. He who does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne to his Son. Reference John 14:6 Jesus said “I am the truth”. Reference John 14:9 “Whoever has seen me has seen the Father” Reference John 10:30 “I and the Father are one.”

19:35 John 1:1, 14 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. Verse 14 and the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

20:35 1 John 4:1-3 The true Spirit will lead us to confess Jesus as Lord. The false spirits will deny that Jesus is Lord.

23:00 Matthew 3:17; Mark 1:11; Luke 3:22 "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

We can make God out to be a Liar in at least two ways: First to refuse to acknowledge the truth about what God says about us: that we are sinners. Secondly refusing to acknowledge what God says about his Son.

23:40 Luke 18:11 the hypocrisy of saying I am glad that I am not like other men.

If you have a false picture of yourself it will distort your vision of God. If you have a false picture of God it will distort your vision of yourself.

1John 1:10 If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

1John 1:5 This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him is no darkness at all.

James 1:17 Every good endowment and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change.

1John 1:6 If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not live according to the truth; 7 but if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 8 If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Deut. 4:29 But from there you will seek the LORD your God, and you will find him, if you search after him with all your heart and with all your soul.

Rom. 8:1 There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

Is. 64:6 We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a polluted garment. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away.

John 10:30 I and the Father are one."

John 1:14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father.

1John 4:1 Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are of God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world.  
2 By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit which confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God, 3 and every spirit which does not confess Jesus is not of God. This is the spirit of antichrist, of which you heard that it was coming, and now it is in the world already.

Matt. 3:17 and lo, a voice from heaven, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

Mark 1:11 and a voice came from heaven, "Thou art my beloved Son; with thee I am well pleased."

Luke 3:22 and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form, as a dove, and a voice came from heaven, "Thou art my beloved Son; with thee I am well pleased."

Luke 18:11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank thee that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector.
