# 11-025-14

PSALM 32

- :00 5:40 Matthew 7:24-27 The wise and foolish builders. Reference 1 Corinthians 3:11. The foundation of Jesus Christ. However the passage from Matthew is really focused on hearing and doing what Jesus says obedience to the word. Comments on understanding scripture.
- 5:40 Psalm 32:1-2 The man is blessed (happy, fulfilled, complete), whose Transgression; Sin; Iniquity is forgiven. Teaching on Sin.
- 11:05 Psalm 103:12 God separates sin from us as far as the East is from the West (out of his reach).
- 11:20 Isaiah 38:17 ....for you have cast my sins behind your back (out of sight).
- 11:30 Jeremiah 31:34 I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more (out of mind).
- 12:00 Teaching on the Mercy seat Old Covenant covering over the Law. The Blood of Christ New Covenant covering of Sin.
  - 14:00 Psalm 32:2 Imputes (counts) no iniquity.

- 14:20 Romans 4:5-6 Teaching on sin and God's provision for it. Not a matter of good works, but of receiving God's mercy through belief and trust in the one who can erase the penalty of iniquity. Reference Romans 5:18-6:4 Just because we are forgiven does not lead to a license to continue to live for sin.
- 21:55 Psalm 32:2 Blessed is he...In whose spirit there is no deceit.
- 22:55 Psalm 32:3-4 David's condition before he confessed his sins with Bathsheba.
- 24:53 Psalm 32:5 I acknowledged my sin to thee, and I did not hide my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"; then thou didst forgive the guilt of my sin. Teaching on confession as opposed to trying to hide the sinful behavior from God. Reference Genesis 3:8-10.
- 28:05 Psalm 51:4 David knew that he had sinned against the Lord himself. Reference 1 John 1:9 If we confess God can cleanse. Forgiveness and cleansing are conditional on confession.
- 29:45 Psalm 32:5 When I confessed, you forgave me of my sin. Un-confessed sin contaminates our relationship with God and other people.
- 32:50 Psalm 32:6 David appeals to everyone to bare themselves to the Lord while we are in the age of Grace, when God is prepared to forgive for the asking. But that age does not last forever. Reference Matthew 25:1-13. There comes a point at which it is too late. Reference Isaiah 55:6-7 Seek the Lord while he may be found; call upon him while he is near....let him return to the Lord to be pardoned.

35:40 Psalm 32:7 You preserve me.

36:25 Psalm 32:8 Let the Lord guide you.

38:40 Psalm 32:10 Many are the sorrows of the wicked who struggle against the Lord's will. Reference Acts 26:14 Don't kick against the goads.

41:05 Psalm 32:11 Be glad in the Lord...all you upright in heart.

Terry appeals to us to take the time to do a self examination of our spiritual wellbeing. Confession, forgiveness and restoration of Joy.

- Matt. 7:24 "Every one then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house upon the rock; 25 and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat upon that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. 26 And every one who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house upon the sand; 27 and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell; and great was the fall of it."
- 1Cor. 3:11 For no other foundation can any one lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.
- <u>Psa. 32:1</u> Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. <u>2</u> Blessed is the man to whom the LORD imputes no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.
- <u>Psa. 103:12</u> as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.
- <u>Is. 38:17</u> Lo, it was for my welfare that I had great bitterness; but thou hast held back my life from the pit of destruction, for thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back.
- Jer. 31:34 And no longer shall each man teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."
- <u>Psa. 32:2</u> Blessed is the man to whom the LORD imputes no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.
- Rom. 4:5 And to one who does not work but trusts him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is reckoned as righteousness. 6 So also David pronounces a blessing upon the man to whom God reckons righteousness apart from works:
- Rom. 5:18 Then as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one man's act of righteousness leads to acquittal and life for all men. 19 For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous. 20 Law came in, to increase the

trespass; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, <u>21</u> so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

- Rom. 6:1 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? 2 By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? 3 Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.
- Psa. 32:2 Blessed is the man to whom the LORD imputes no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit. 3 When I declared not my sin, my body wasted away through my groaning all day long. 4 For day and night thy hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer. [Selah] 5 I acknowledged my sin to thee, and I did not hide my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"; then thou didst forgive the guilt of my sin. [Selah]
- Gen. 3:8 And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard the sound of thee in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself."
- <u>Psa. 51:4</u> Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in thy sight, so that thou art justified in thy sentence and blameless in thy judgment.
- 1John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- <u>Psa. 32:5</u> I acknowledged my sin to thee, and I did not hide my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"; then thou didst forgive the guilt of my sin. [Selah] <u>6</u> Therefore let every one who is godly offer prayer to thee; at a time of distress, in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him.

Matt. 25:1 "Then the kingdom of heaven shall be compared to ten maidens who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. 2 Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. 3 For when the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; 4 but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. 5 As the bridegroom was delayed, they all slumbered and slept. 6 But at midnight there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' 7 Then all those maidens rose and trimmed their lamps. 8 And the foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' 9 But the wise replied, 'Perhaps there will not be enough for us and for you; go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.' 10 And while they went to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast; and the door was shut. 11 Afterward the other maidens came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' 12 But he replied, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' 13 Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

<u>Is. 55:6</u> "Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; <u>7</u> let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, that he may have mercy on him, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

Psa. 32:7 Thou art a hiding place for me, thou preservest me from trouble; thou dost encompass me with deliverance. [Selah] 8 I will instruct you and teach you the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you. 9 Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, else it will not keep with you. 10 Many are the pangs of the wicked; but steadfast love surrounds him who trusts in the LORD. 11 Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

Acts 26:14 And when we had all fallen to the ground, I heard a voice saying to me in the Hebrew language, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me? It hurts you to kick against the goads.'
