12:10 Luke 2:8-12 The angel visits the shepherds to announce the birth of the Savior.

12:50 Acts 1:10-11 why do you stand here looking into the sky...Jesus will come back in the same way....

20:00 Revelation 1:1 The unveiling of Jesus Christ, not the revelation of John. Terry gives a very short and quick snapshot synopsis on the book of the Revelation.

We live in a world and a time of both suffering and sovereignty. We can't just gloss over the suffering by looking only at the Sovereignty and we can't just look at the suffering only and overlook God's sovereignty. We need to understand them in light of God's word to us.
