GLORY IN THE CHURCH

:00-4:25 Wonderful synopsis of the two covenants which God initiated with his people (Old and New), and the signs of the covenants (Circumcision and Baptism).

4:25 Ephesians 1:11-12 (RSV), In Jesus everything that the Father wills for us, is available to us, such as, our destiny and appointment to live to the praise and glory of God. Christians have a destiny.

6:05 Matthew 5:16 Let your light so shine..... Teaching. Our lives are to be reflectors of God's glory.

8:00 1 Corinthians 6:19-20your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit..... You are not your own – therefore glorify God in your body. Teaching. Further the Church is also the Body – Teaching.

11:00 Exodus 29:43-46 The Lord establishes a place of meeting with his people (Tabernacle-Tent). This place is more proximate than before Reference Exodus 19:12-13.

14:00 Exodus 40:34-35 The Glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle. Teaching

16:30 2 Chronicles 6:7-11 Solomon comments on building the temple. In approximately 970 B.C. the "Tent" tabernacle was replaced by a great temple.

17:45 2 Chronicles 6:18 Solomon considers the temple and wonders "but will God indeed dwell with man on the earth?"

18:15 2 Chronicles 7:1-3 God's glory filled the temple, so much so, that the priests could not enter, and, the people bowed down with their face to the ground. God wants his glory to be manifested in his people.

19:20 John 2:19-22 Jesus speaks of his body as the temple. Teaching.

22:00 Matthew 17:2 (Mark 9:2) Jesus is transfigured with the radiance of God's glory. Reference John 1:14 John says of Jesus – we beheld his glory. Reference 2 Peter 1:16-18 Peter also testifies to seeing the majesty of God in Jesus.

Glory in the tabernacle, Glory in the temple, Glory in the body of Jesus and Glory in Jesus' present body, the church and his people.

24:25 John 17:4-5 Jesus asks the Father to glorify him to the status that he had at the creation – on the basis that he had finished the work the Father had given him to accomplish. The church and us individually can only glorify God if we move in the purpose of God for our lives. Don't allow anything to come between our relationship with God (example of solar eclipse).

28:15 Ephesians 3:16-21 Paul prays that the Ephesians are 1. strengthened with power through the Spirit, because of the riches of God's glory 2. That Christ will dwell in our hearts through faith 3. That they will fathom the fullness of God's love so that they will remain filled with the Lord. With the Lord's

fullness in us we can do more than we can even imagine. Let his body the church and each of us bring glory to him now and forever.

Deliver us from the tyranny of our feelings and our problems and fill us Lord.

Eph. 1:11 In him, according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to the counsel of his will, 12 we who first hoped in Christ have been destined and appointed to live for the praise of his glory.

Matt. 5:16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.

1Cor. 6:19 Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God? You are not your own; 20 you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

Ex. 29:43 There I will meet with the people of Israel, and it shall be sanctified by my glory; 44 I will consecrate the tent of meeting and the altar; Aaron also and his sons I will consecrate, to serve me as priests. 45 And I will dwell among the people of Israel, and will be their God. 46 And they shall know that I am the LORD their God, who brought them forth out of the land of Egypt that I might dwell among them; I am the LORD their God.

Ex. 19:12 And you shall set bounds for the people round about, saying, 'Take heed that you do not go up into the mountain or touch the border of it; whoever touches the mountain shall be put to death; 13 no hand shall touch him, but he shall be stoned or shot; whether beast or man, he shall not live.' When the trumpet sounds a long blast, they shall come up to the mountain."

Ex. 40:34 Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle. 35 And Moses was not able to enter the tent of meeting, because the cloud abode upon it, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle.

2Chr. 6:7 Now it was in the heart of David my father to build a house for the name of the LORD, the God of Israel. 8 But the LORD said to David my father, 'Whereas it was in your heart to build a house for my name, you did well that it was in your heart; 9 nevertheless you shall not build the house, but your son who shall be born to you shall build the house for my name.' 10 Now the LORD has fulfilled his promise which he made; for I have risen in the place of David my father, and sit on the throne of Israel, as the LORD promised, and I have built the house for the name of the LORD, the God of Israel. 11 And there I have set the ark, in which is the covenant of the LORD which he made with

the people of Israel.”

2Chr. 6:18 “But will God dwell indeed with man on the earth? Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain thee; how much less this house which I have built!

2Chr. 7:1 When Solomon had ended his prayer, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices, and the glory of the LORD filled the temple. 2 And the priests could not enter the house of the LORD, because the glory of the LORD filled the LORD’s house. 3 When all the children of Israel saw the fire come down and the glory of the LORD upon the temple, they bowed down with their faces to the earth on the pavement, and worshiped and gave thanks to the LORD, saying, “For he is good, for his steadfast love endures for ever.”

John 2:19 Jesus answered them, “Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.” 20 The Jews then said, “It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?” 21 But he spoke of the temple of his body. 22 When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word which Jesus had spoken.

Matt. 17:2 And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light.

Mark 9:2 And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves; and he was transfigured before them,

John 1:14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father.

2Pet. 1:16 For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. 17 For when he received honor and glory from God the Father and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased,” 18 we heard this voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain.

John 17:4 I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do; 5 and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made.

Eph. 3:16 that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with might through his Spirit in the inner man, 17 and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, 18 may have power to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, 19 and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fulness of God.

Eph. 3:20 Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, 21 to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen.
