18-038-19 THE CHURCH THAT JESUS BUILT

3:00 Terry makes an observation on the Liturgy. He equates it, to the order of worship, as one might equate a recipe to the final meal. A person does not eat the recipe, he enjoys what it produces.

4:00 It is important to discern where God is moving in your life and respond to it. Reference John 6:38 Jesus did only what the Father told him to do. The peace of God is found in his path for you, and nowhere else. The power of God is also found in his purpose for you - individuals and churches.

6:00 What kind of church is Jesus building in your body.

6:30 1 Chronicles 17:10-14 David wants to build a physical house for the Lord but God tells him that his line will produce one whose kingdom will last forever. The Kingdom is a primary theme for Jesus' teaching. Reference Matthew 3:2; 4:17; Matthew 6:33. Further God tells David that this coming one (Messiah) will build a house for him.

9:00 Matthew 6:10 Teaching on God's kingdom – What is it? It is that state of affairs where God's will and purpose is being worked out in the lives and hearts of God's people. It is where God's will is fulfilled. Jesus is the embodiment of the kingdom, for he perfectly fulfilled God's purpose for him.

- 10:00 1 Chronicles 17:10-14 Teaching He will build a house for me. Teaching His kingdom will last forever.

 Teaching I will be his father and he will be my son. Reference Matthew 21:9 "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"
- 13:10 Jeremiah 23:5-6 Teaching. The Lord will raise up for David a righteous Branch and he will be called The Lord is our righteousness. This prophecy given 450 years after David.
- 14:40 Zechariah 6:12-13 The Branch shall build the temple and he will sit upon the throne as the great high priest of the kingdom. Question: What is the temple that the Messiah will build? Four New Testament passages illuminate the answer.
- 17:05 John 2:19-22 Jesus speaks of the temple as his body. Reference John 1:1-2,14 Jesus was the dwelling of God among his people. Reference 2 Chronicles 7:1-2 The Glory of the Lord filled the temple (Solomon's) and the temple (Jesus) Reference Matthew 17:2; Mark 9:2. Reference witness of John, Peter John 1:14; 2 Peter 1:16-18. Reference Ephesians 2:11-22 Through Jesus we are brought into the presence of God and the new creation. The Living church. Reference Acts 17:24. God's temple is the hearts and lives of believing people.
- 24:45 1 Peter 2:4-5 Believers and followers are built into the temple of God. Teaching on the progression from becoming a new creation born again John 3:3-8 to becoming a living stone in God's temple.

26:00 Revelation 21:1-2, 22 The new heaven and new earth will have no temple, because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple.

28:00 Teaching about the "Church" life at St. Paul's and an awakening to a prophecy from the Lord, given through a member, about what St. Paul's would be. Not a building program!

Remainder of the teaching is about St. Paul's wider ministry.

John 6:38 For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me.

- Jer. 23:5 "The days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will raise up to David a righteous Branch, a King who will reign wisely and do what is just and right in the land.
- Jer. 23:6 In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety.

This is the name by which he will be called: The LORD Our Righteousness.

- Zech. 6:12 Tell him this is what the LORD Almighty says: 'Here is the man whose name is the Branch, and he will branch out from his place and build the temple of the LORD. 13 It is he who will build the temple of the LORD, and he will be clothed with majesty and will sit and rule on his throne. And he will be a priest on his throne. And there will be harmony between the two.'
- John 2:19 Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."
- John 2:20 The Jews replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" 21 But the temple he had spoken of was his body. 22 After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.
- <u>John 1:1</u> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning.
- John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

- <u>2Chr. 7:1</u> When Solomon finished praying, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices, and the glory of the LORD filled the temple. <u>2</u> The priests could not enter the temple of the LORD because the glory of the LORD filled it.
- Matt. 17:2 There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light.
- Mark 9:2 After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them.
- John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- 2Pet. 1:16 We did not follow cleverly invented stories when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. 17 For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." 18 We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.
- Eph. 2:11 Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called "uncircumcised" by those who call themselves "the circumcision" (that done in the body by the hands of men)— 12 remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ.
- Eph. 2:14 For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, 15 by abolishing in his flesh the law with its commandments and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new man out of the two, thus making peace, 16 and in this one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. 17 He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. 18 For through him we both have

access to the Father by one Spirit.

- Eph. 2:19 Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, 20 built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. 21 In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. 22 And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.
- Acts 17:24 "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by hands.
- 1Pet. 2:4 As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by men but chosen by God and precious to him— 5 you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.
- John 3:3 In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again."
- <u>John 3:4</u> "How can a man be born when he is old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!"
- John 3:5 Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit. 6 Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. 7 You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' 8 The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."
- Rev. 21:1 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. 2 I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband.
- Rev. 21:22 I did not see a temple in the city, because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple.
