921002-28 LUKE/ACTS: BEGINNINGS

- 1:40 John 14:12 "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father".
- 5:00 The church (Body of Christ) is the continuation of God's work on earth.
- 6:10 Luke 1:1 The account of the things that have been fulfilled (by the presence of Jesus). We are to be his Witnesses and Servants.
- 11:00 John 1:14 We beheld his Glory. 1 John 1:1 We have heard, seen and touched the Lord of Lords.
- 12:00 Hebrews 1:1-2 God spoke through the Prophets but in these last days he has spoken to us by his son.
 - 13:30 John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word (Jesus).
- 15:30 John 1:45 and Luke 24:27 The Scriptures, even the Old Testament speak of Jesus as the fulfillment. God still speaks to us today through the scripture.
- 17:30 Luke 1:4 Luke tells Theophilus that he is writing his account so that he may be <u>certain</u> of his belief.

- 32:40 Luke 24:49 "I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."
- 35:00 It will not be possible to have an effective witness without the Holy Spirit. Knowledge, effort and wisdom will never take the place of the Spirit's presence.
- 43:10 The Kingdom of God is that state of affairs when the will and purpose of God is being done here on Earth.
- 45:20 Matthew 7:21-22 Luke 6:46 All these speak to the reality of Kingdom living. It is not those who call Jesus Lord who inhabit the Kingdom but those who <u>do</u> his will.
- 45:50 Matthew 6:33 How does one find the will of God for their life? By expressing the willingness to do the will first. Willingness to do his will is a precondition to knowing his will.

The Lordship of Jesus is the primary condition. Lordship is more prevalent in the scripture than Salvation. We are saved to serve in his will.

- 51:50 There are two kingdoms that you might serve: **1**. Your own kingdom or **2**. God's Kingdom. Adam chose his own and established a rival kingdom here on earth. If you choose your own Kingdom then Jesus is still on the cross. If you choose the Lord's kingdom then you are on the cross are you ready? Paul in Galatians 2:20 said that he was crucified with Christ. The question is Who is in charge in your life?
- 56:40 A quote form the missionary Jim Elliott: "He is no fool who gives up what he cannot keep, to gain that which he cannot lose".

- <u>John 14:12</u> I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father.
- <u>Luke 1:1</u> Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us,
- <u>John 1:14</u> The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- 1John 1:1 That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.
- Heb. 1:1 In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, $\underline{2}$ but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe.
- <u>John 1:1</u> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- John 1:45 Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."
- <u>Luke 24:27</u> And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.
- <u>Luke 1:3</u> Therefore, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, it seemed good also to me to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, $\underline{4}$ so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.
- Luke 24:44 He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

Luke 24:45 Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. 46 He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, 47 and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Luke 24:50 When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. 51 While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven. 52 Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. 53 And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.

Acts 1:1 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach 2 until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. 3 After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. 4 On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. 5 For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Matt. 7:21 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. 22 Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and in your name drive out demons and perform many miracles?'

<u>Luke 6:46</u> "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say?

<u>Matt. 6:33</u> But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

Gal. 2:20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

John 3:3 In reply Jesus declared, "I tell you the truth, no one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again."

John 3:4 "How can a man be born when he is old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!"

Matt. 10:38 and anyone who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.

Matt. 16:24 Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.

Mark 8:34 Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.

<u>Luke 9:23</u> Then he said to them all: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me.

<u>Luke 14:27</u> And anyone who does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.
