THE HOLY SPIRIT: KEY TO THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

1:25 Apart from the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives it is not possible to live a life that glorifies God. The Christian life is not difficult; it is impossible, within our own power.

2:30 Three things to consider in regard to living in relationship to the Holy Spirit. The Promise. The Problem and The Provision.

3:00 (The Promise) Jeremiah 31:31-34. A new covenant not of law that God's people broke, but one that will be written not on stone tablets, but on the minds and hearts of God's people.

5:00 Exodus 34:28 The Old Covenant – the Ten Commandments.

6:00 John 14:15 “If you love me you will obey what I command”. It is not possible to love God and not do what he asks.

12:20 (The Promise) Ezekiel 36:26-27 “ I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws”.

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15:40 (The Promise) John 14:16-17 "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever-the Spirit of truth"

18:45 John 14: 17 continued.... "The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you"

20:15 (The Problem) Romans 7. First Terry teaches from chapter 6 on how we die with Christ.

21:10 Romans 6:1-4 Reading.

22:45 2Corinthians 5:21 and 5:14-15

25:00 Romans 7:7-25 Teaching on how it is that we do those things which we do not want to do and often do not do the things which we should. The conflict within. The battle between our mind, emotions and will, over against the Spirit of God.

42:40 (The Provision) Romans 8:1-11 "Life through the Spirit". Verses 9-11 "You however, are controlled not by the sinful nature but by the Spirit, if the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ. But if Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, yet your spirit is alive because of righteousness. And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit, who lives in you".

50:10 Hebrews 8:6-13 Teaching on the place of the new covenant in relation to the old covenant. Reference to Jeremiah 31:31 and the New Covenant – Hebrews 8: Verse 13 states that

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the first (old) covenant is obsolete. The new covenant is to have the Spirit of God within us so that we may have the mind of Christ. 2 Corinthians 3:1-6 (Verse 6 – The letter kills but the Spirit gives Life.)

Jer. 31:31 “The time is coming,” declares the LORD,
“when I will make a new covenant
with the house of Israel
and with the house of Judah.

Jer. 31:32 It will not be like the covenant
I made with their forefathers
when I took them by the hand
to lead them out of Egypt,
because they broke my covenant,
though I was a husband to them,” declares the LORD.

Jer. 31:33 “This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel
after that time,” declares the LORD.

“I will put my law in their minds
and write it on their hearts.

I will be their God,
and they will be my people.

Jer. 31:34 No longer will a man teach his neighbor,
or a man his brother, saying, ‘Know the LORD,’
because they will all know me,
from the least of them to the greatest,”
declares the LORD.

“For I will forgive their wickedness
and will remember their sins no more.”

Ex. 34:28 Moses was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights without
eating bread or drinking water. And he wrote on the tablets the words of the
covenant—the Ten Commandments.

John 14:15 “If you love me, you will obey what I command.

Ezek. 36:26 I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove
from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. 27 And I will put

my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws.

John 14:16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever— 17 the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you.

Rom. 6:1 What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? 2 By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? 3 Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

2Cor. 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

2Cor. 5:14 For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. 15 And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.

Rom. 7:7 What shall we say, then? Is the law sin? Certainly not! Indeed I would not have known what sin was except through the law. For I would not have known what coveting really was if the law had not said, "Do not covet." 8 But sin, seizing the opportunity afforded by the commandment, produced in me every kind of covetous desire. For apart from law, sin is dead. 9 Once I was alive apart from law; but when the commandment came, sin sprang to life and I died. 10 I found that the very commandment that was intended to bring life actually brought death. 11 For sin, seizing the opportunity afforded by the commandment, deceived me, and through the commandment put me to death. 12 So then, the law is holy, and the commandment is holy, righteous and good.

Rom. 7:13 Did that which is good, then, become death to me? By no means!

But in order that sin might be recognized as sin, it produced death in me through what was good, so that through the commandment sin might become utterly sinful.

Rom. 7:14 We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. 15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16 And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17 As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18 I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19 For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. 20 Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it.

Rom. 7:21 So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. 22 For in my inner being I delight in God's law; 23 but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members. 24 What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? 25 Thanks be to God—through Jesus Christ our Lord!

So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in the sinful nature a slave to the law of sin.

Rom. 8:1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, 2 because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death. 3 For what the law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the sinful nature, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful man to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in sinful man, 4 in order that the righteous requirements of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the sinful nature but according to the Spirit.

Rom. 8:5 Those who live according to the sinful nature have their minds set on what that nature desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. 6 The mind of

sinful man is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace; 7 the sinful mind is hostile to God. It does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. 8 Those controlled by the sinful nature cannot please God.

Rom. 8:9 You, however, are controlled not by the sinful nature but by the Spirit, if the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ. 10 But if Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, yet your spirit is alive because of righteousness. 11 And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit, who lives in you.

Heb. 8:6 But the ministry Jesus has received is as superior to theirs as the covenant of which he is mediator is superior to the old one, and it is founded on better promises.

Heb. 8:7 For if there had been nothing wrong with that first covenant, no place would have been sought for another. 8 But God found fault with the people and said:

“The time is coming, declares the Lord,
when I will make a new covenant
with the house of Israel
and with the house of Judah.

Heb. 8:9 It will not be like the covenant
I made with their forefathers
when I took them by the hand
to lead them out of Egypt,
because they did not remain faithful to my covenant,
and I turned away from them,
declares the Lord.

Heb. 8:10 This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel
after that time, declares the Lord.

I will put my laws in their minds

and write them on their hearts.

I will be their God,
and they will be my people.

Heb. 8:11 No longer will a man teach his neighbor,
or a man his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,'
because they will all know me,
from the least of them to the greatest.

Heb. 8:12 For I will forgive their wickedness
and will remember their sins no more."

Heb. 8:13 By calling this covenant "new," he has made the first one obsolete;
and what is obsolete and aging will soon disappear.

2Cor. 3:1 Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Or do we need, like
some people, letters of recommendation to you or from you? 2 You
yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by
everybody. 3 You show that you are a letter from Christ, the result of
our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God,
not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.

2Cor. 3:4 Such confidence as this is ours through Christ before God. 5 Not
that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves,
but our competence comes from God. 6 He has made us competent
as ministers of a new covenant—not of the letter but of the Spirit; for
the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.
