Scriptural References and Comment Notes

921202-28 LYING TO THE HOLY SPIRIT, AND YOU

2:30 The Scripture does not make an effort to gloss over the sins of even the most respected saints. David confesses his sins and begs God's forgiveness in Psalm 51.

3:40 1 Corinthians 10:6, 11 We are to take heed from the lessons of the past to avoid repeating evil deeds. The scripture gives us examples of the failing of others that might do us well to recall.

4:30 Acts 5:1-11 Ananias and Sapphira decide to mislead Peter and in the process find that they were really lying to the Holy Spirit.

11:00 Acts 4:32-37 The context of the attitudes of the 1st generation believers. They were internally moved to release their possessions for the greater good of the kingdom.

17:20 Acts 2:42-47 "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer". Read verses 42-47.

23:40 Acts 5:3 The question arises as to how Peter knew that Ananias and Sapphira had conspired to give a false impression to the church. Perhaps it was what the scripture calls a word of knowledge as described in 1 Corinthians 12:8.

33:50 1 John 5:16-17 Teaching on the sin unto death. Terry clarifies the distinction between this sin and the “unforgiveable” sin mentioned in Matthew 12:31. The “unforgiveable sin” applies only to the unbeliever. The sin unto death in this 1st John passage applies to believers.

43:00 1 Corinthians 11: 23-34 Terry offers a point on the Sin that leads to death for the believers. The “body” referred to in verse 29 is not the physical body of Jesus but the Church, his corporate body of worship and service. It refers to the sin of estrangement and hostility among the believers. Taking the bread and the cup while in an attitude of disparagement against those who should be brothers and sisters in Christ.

54: 1 Samuel 16:7 “...the Lord does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart”

59:00 1 Samuel 2:3b “...for the Lord is a God who knows, and by him deeds are weighed”.

59:50 1 Chronicles 28:9 “..... The Lord searches every heart and understands every motive behind every thought”.

1:00:50 Psalm 44:20-21 God knows the secrets of the heart.

1:01:20 Psalm 139:23-24 “Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting”.

Psa. 51:1 Have mercy on me, O God,
according to your unfailing love;
according to your great compassion
blot out my transgressions.

2 Wash away all my iniquity
and cleanse me from my sin.

3 For I know my transgressions,
and my sin is always before me.

1Cor. 10:6 Now these things occurred as examples to keep us from
setting our hearts on evil things as they did.

1Cor. 10:11 These things happened to them as examples and were
written down as warnings for us, on whom the fulfillment of the ages has
come.

Acts 5:1 Now a man named Ananias, together with his wife Sapphira, also
sold a piece of property. 2 With his wife's full knowledge he kept back part of
the money for himself, but brought the rest and put it at the apostles' feet.

Acts 5:3 Then Peter said, "Ananias, how is it that Satan has so filled your
heart that you have lied to the Holy Spirit and have kept for yourself some of
the money you received for the land? 4 Didn't it belong to you before it was
sold? And after it was sold, wasn't the money at your disposal? What made you
think of doing such a thing? You have not lied to men but to God."

Acts 5:5 When Ananias heard this, he fell down and died. And great fear
seized all who heard what had happened. 6 Then the young men came
forward, wrapped up his body, and carried him out and buried him.

Acts 5:7 About three hours later his wife came in, not knowing what had
happened. 8 Peter asked her, "Tell me, is this the price you and Ananias got
for the land?"

"Yes," she said, "that is the price."

Acts 5:9 Peter said to her, "How could you agree to test the Spirit of the
Lord? Look! The feet of the men who buried your husband are at the door, and

they will carry you out also.”

Acts 5:10 At that moment she fell down at his feet and died. Then the young men came in and, finding her dead, carried her out and buried her beside her husband. 11 Great fear seized the whole church and all who heard about these events.

Acts 4:32 All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had. 33 With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and much grace was upon them all. 34 There were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned lands or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales 35 and put it at the apostles’ feet, and it was distributed to anyone as he had need.

Acts 4:36 Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means Son of Encouragement), 37 sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles’ feet.

Acts 2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Acts 5:3 Then Peter said, “Ananias, how is it that Satan has so filled your heart that you have lied to the Holy Spirit and have kept for yourself some of the money you received for the land?

1Cor. 12:8 To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit,

1John 5:16 If anyone sees his brother commit a sin that does not lead to death, he should pray and God will give him life. I refer to those whose sin

does not lead to death. There is a sin that leads to death. I am not saying that he should pray about that. 17 All wrongdoing is sin, and there is sin that does not lead to death.

Matt. 12:31 And so I tell you, every sin and blasphemy will be forgiven men, but the blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven.

1Cor. 11:23 For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, 24 and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, “This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.” 25 In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.” 26 For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

1Cor. 11:27 Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. 28 A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. 29 For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment on himself. 30 That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep. 31 But if we judged ourselves, we would not come under judgment. 32 When we are judged by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be condemned with the world.

1Cor. 11:33 So then, my brothers, when you come together to eat, wait for each other. 34 If anyone is hungry, he should eat at home, so that when you meet together it may not result in judgment.

And when I come I will give further directions.
