921217-28 FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT

- 1:35 The term Filled with the Spirit does not occur in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, John, nor in the letters of John or in Peter. The expression occurs three times in the Gospel of Luke and 10 times in the Acts of the Apostles. Luke and Paul (friends) are the two who mention the subject.
- 2:45 A look at the subject "Filled with the Spirit" as it is mentioned in the passages from Luke and Acts.
- 3:35 Luke 1:11-15 Verse 15 He (John the Baptist) will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth. Many will rejoice in him and he will be great in the sight of the lord. He was the first prophet in Israel in over 400 years.
- 9:50 Luke 1:39-45 Verse 41 Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit.
- 10:00 Luke 1:62-67 Zechariah (John the Baptist's father) was filled with the Holy Spirit and Prophesied.

Humility is one sign of being filled with the Spirit. Prophecy is also one of the manifestations of the Spirit – Speaking the right thing at the right time, into situation that requires God's instruction.

16:00 Acts 2:4 120 filled with the Spirit – Manifestation – Speaking in Tongues.

- 21:00 Acts 4:8 Peter was filled with the Spirit. Manifestation Holy Boldness, to speak God's truth.
- 26:30 Acts 4:31 They were all filled with the Holy Spirit. Manifestation -Boldness.
- 29:40 Acts 6:3 Choose those who are full of the Spirit and Wisdom. Wisdom is a manifestation of the Spirit. We need to move in the direction that God has called us to, shown by His gifting to us. God's purpose and power go together. We cannot use His power to accomplish our purpose.
- 37:00 Acts 6:5 Stephen is chosen as one who is full of grace and the Holy Spirit. Verses 5-15 Stephen is full of wisdom and boldness. He lost his life in service to the Lord.
- 42:00 Acts 7:55 The Holy Spirit is out to accomplish the purpose of God on earth and Stephen was obedient and full of the Holy Spirit (full of God's purpose). Power, humility, mercy, boldness, forgiveness.
- 46:00 Acts 9:5 Saul (Paul), asks the most important question ever to be asked by any of us Who are you Lord? Terry then uses the information contained in the same account later in the book Chapter 22: 8–10. Verse 10 describes the second most important question: 22:10 What shall I do Lord? or what would you have me to do? The desire to fulfill the purpose of God is evidence of the filling of the Spirit.
- 54:50 Acts 9:17 Saul (Paul) is to be filled with the Holy Spirit.
 - 59:00 Acts 11:19-30 (24) Barnabas was full of the Spirit.
 - 1:02 Acts 13:9 Saul becomes Paul.

- Luke 1:11 Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. 12 When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. 13 But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John. 14 He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, 15 for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth.
- Luke 1:39 At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, 40 where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. 41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. 42 In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! 43 But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. 45 Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!"
- Luke 1:62 Then they made signs to his father, to find out what he would like to name the child. 63 He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone's astonishment he wrote, "His name is John." 64 Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue was loosed, and he began to speak, praising God. 65 The neighbors were all filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. 66 Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking, "What then is this child going to be?" For the Lord's hand was with him.
- <u>Luke 1:67</u> His father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied:
- Acts 2:4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.
- <u>Acts 4:8</u> Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them: "Rulers and elders of the people!
- Acts 4:31 After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken.

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.

- Acts 6:3 Brothers, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them
- Acts 6:5 This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch, a convert to Judaism. 6 They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.
- Acts 6:7 So the word of God spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem increased rapidly, and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith.
- Acts 6:8 Now Stephen, a man full of God's grace and power, did great wonders and miraculous signs among the people. 9 Opposition arose, however, from members of the Synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called)—Jews of Cyrene and Alexandria as well as the provinces of Cilicia and Asia. These men began to argue with Stephen, 10 but they could not stand up against his wisdom or the Spirit by whom he spoke.
- Acts 6:11 Then they secretly persuaded some men to say, "We have heard Stephen speak words of blasphemy against Moses and against God."
- Acts 6:12 So they stirred up the people and the elders and the teachers of the law. They seized Stephen and brought him before the Sanhedrin. 13 They produced false witnesses, who testified, "This fellow never stops speaking against this holy place and against the law. 14 For we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and change the customs Moses handed down to us."
- Acts 6:15 All who were sitting in the Sanhedrin looked intently at Stephen, and they saw that his face was like the face of an angel.
- Acts 7:55 But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God.
- Acts 9:5 "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked.

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied.

Acts 22:8 "'Who are you, Lord?' I asked.

"'I am Jesus of Nazareth, whom you are persecuting,' he replied. 9 My companions saw the light, but they did not understand the voice of him who was speaking to me.

Acts 22:10 " 'What shall I do, Lord?' I asked.

"'Get up,' the Lord said, 'and go into Damascus. There you will be told all that you have been assigned to do.'

Acts 9:17 Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. Placing his hands on Saul, he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

Acts 11:19 Now those who had been scattered by the persecution in connection with Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, telling the message only to Jews. 20 Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. 21 The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord.

Acts 11:22 News of this reached the ears of the church at Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. 23 When he arrived and saw the evidence of the grace of God, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. 24 He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord.

Acts 11:25 Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, 26 and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

Acts 11:27 During this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. 28 One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through the Spirit

predicted that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.) 29 The disciples, each according to his ability, decided to provide help for the brothers living in Judea. 30 This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

Acts 13:9 Then Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked straight at Elymas and said,
