930311-28 THE HOLY SPIRIT, THE SCRIPTURES, AND YOU

2:40 Acts 1:12-20 About 1,000 years before it happened, The Holy Spirit spoke through David about what was to be fulfilled in reference to the Messiah and a traitor.

13:00 2 Timothy 3:15-16 The Old Testament was able to make you wise unto the way of salvation. Verse 16 All scripture is God-breathed (Inspired) by the Holy Spirit. For Teaching, Rebuking, Correcting and training in Righteousness.

15:10 Isaiah 53:5-7 The Prophet predicted the Messiah 700 years before the incarnation, and told of his treatment at the hands of the religious authorities.

29:40 2 Samuel 23:1-2 David recognizes that the Holy Spirit spoke through him. God has spoken to people in a way that they were able to convey to others what God wanted to preserve. That is the Inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

34:00 – 57:00 Terry takes a digression from the main focus, to teach on the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in the Church age - the gift of prophecy and how it works.

57:00 Acts 4:23-31 Verse 25 - You spoke by the Holy Spirit through the mouth of David. Verse 31 – and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of the Lord boldly.

1:01:20 Acts 7:51-53 “You always resist the Holy Spirit”

1:09:35 2 Peter 1:21 Prophecy is of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 1:12 Then they returned to Jerusalem from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day's walk from the city. 13 When they arrived, they went upstairs to the room where they were staying. Those present were Peter, John, James and Andrew; Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew; James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. 14 They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Acts 1:15 In those days Peter stood up among the believers (a group numbering about a hundred and twenty) 16 and said, "Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled which the Holy Spirit spoke long ago through the mouth of David concerning Judas, who served as guide for those who arrested Jesus— 17 he was one of our number and shared in this ministry."

Acts 1:18 (With the reward he got for his wickedness, Judas bought a field; there he fell headlong, his body burst open and all his intestines spilled out. 19 Everyone in Jerusalem heard about this, so they called that field in their language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.)

Acts 1:20 "For," said Peter, "it is written in the book of Psalms,

" 'May his place be deserted;
let there be no one to dwell in it,' and,

" 'May another take his place of leadership.'

2Tim. 3:15 and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness,

Is. 53:5 But he was pierced for our transgressions,
he was crushed for our iniquities;
the punishment that brought us peace was upon him,
and by his wounds we are healed.

Is. 53:6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray,

each of us has turned to his own way;
and the LORD has laid on him
the iniquity of us all.

Is. 53:7 He was oppressed and afflicted,
yet he did not open his mouth;
he was led like a lamb to the slaughter,
and as a sheep before her shearers is silent,
so he did not open his mouth.

2Sam. 23:1 These are the last words of David:

“The oracle of David son of Jesse,
the oracle of the man exalted by the Most High,
the man anointed by the God of Jacob,
Israel’s singer of songs:

2Sam. 23:2 “The Spirit of the LORD spoke through me;
his word was on my tongue.

Acts 4:23 On their release, Peter and John went back to their own people and reported all that the chief priests and elders had said to them. 24 When they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. “Sovereign Lord,” they said, “you made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything in them.

25 You spoke by the Holy Spirit through the mouth of your servant, our father David:

“ ‘Why do the nations rage
and the peoples plot in vain?

Acts 4:26 The kings of the earth take their stand
and the rulers gather together
against the Lord
and against his Anointed One.’

27 Indeed Herod and Pontius Pilate met together with the Gentiles and the people of Israel in this city to conspire against your holy servant Jesus, whom

you anointed. 28 They did what your power and will had decided beforehand should happen. 29 Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. 30 Stretch out your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus.”

Acts 4:31 After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.

Acts 7:51 “You stiff-necked people, with uncircumcised hearts and ears! You are just like your fathers: You always resist the Holy Spirit! 52 Was there ever a prophet your fathers did not persecute? They even killed those who predicted the coming of the Righteous One. And now you have betrayed and murdered him— 53 you who have received the law that was put into effect through angels but have not obeyed it.”

2Pet. 1:21 For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.
