17-179-30 NO OTHER GODS BEFORE ME

:00 – 6:30 An overview under the heading of a No-Fault society. Terry takes a look at the Ten Commandments as the initial framework put forth by God for the preservation of his people.

6:40 Exodus 20:3-17 and Deuteronomy 5:7-21. The Ten Commandments. The Exodus passage sets the context of the giving of the commandments and Deuteronomy is a retelling of the Exodus events. Teaching on the giving of the commandments.

13:05 Deuteronomy 5:1-7 Learning and then following. The preface to the commandments was the understanding that God was in covenant with his people. The sign of the covenant was circumcision. This was an external sign of what was to come as an internal grace.

16:20 Exodus 20:1 God spoke. Teaching on God's Self-Revelation.

20:35 John 1:1-2 & 14 In the beginning was the Word. Reference Genesis 1:1 In the beginning.

21:30 Hebrews 1:1-2 God's revelation through his son. Teaching on Jesus as the Word.

26:00 Exodus 20:1-2 "I am the Lord your God" Teaching.

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30:25 Exodus 20:2 The God who delivers his people from slavery to freedom and a teaching on the parallelism to the new covenant.

34:05 Exodus 20:3 You shall have no other gods before me. Teaching on the history of man's thoughts about god. Polytheism (sub set Animism), Henotheism (Reference Judges 11:24), Monotheism.

43:25 Deuteronomy 6:13-15 The Lord is a jealous God. Reference Exodus 34:14 The Lord whose name is jealous. Teaching on the difference between human jealousy and the jealousy of God. Reference John 10:10 the abundant life. Another aspect; Matthew 10:34-37 Jesus makes a claim on those who follow; he is to be the first devotion of our lives. Reference Luke 14:25-27 Cost of Discipleship.

52:30 Romans 7:14-25 Paul expounds on the battle that takes place when trying to keep God's law. God provides the way – Reference Romans 8:1-4 Living through the Spirit.

56:00 Exodus 34:28 God gave the words of the covenant – the Ten Commandments. Reference Ezekiel 36:25-27 God will put a new Spirit in us so that the laws will no longer be external, but they will be upon our heart. Teaching on yielding to the Holy Spirit.

Deut. 5:1 Moses summoned all Israel and said:

Hear, O Israel, the decrees and laws I declare in your hearing today. Learn
them and be sure to follow them. 2 The LORD our God made a covenant with us
at Horeb. 3 It was not with our fathers that the LORD made this covenant, but
with us, with all of us who are alive here today. 4 The LORD spoke to you face
to face out of the fire on the mountain. 5 (At that time I stood between the
LORD and you to declare to you the word of the LORD, because you were afraid
of the fire and did not go up the mountain.) And he said: 6 “I am the LORD
your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.

Deut. 5:7 “You shall have no other gods before me.

Deut. 5:8 “You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in
heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. 9 You shall not

bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, 10 but showing love to a thousand[generations] of those who love me and keep my commandments.

Deut. 5:11 “You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses his name.

Deut. 5:12 “Observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy, as the LORD your God has commanded you. 13 Six days you shall labor and do all your work, 14 but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your ox, your donkey or any of your animals, nor the alien within your gates, so that your manservant and maidservant may rest, as you do. 15 Remember that you were slaves in Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out of there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God has commanded you to observe the Sabbath day.

Deut. 5:16 “Honor your father and your mother, as the LORD your God has commanded you, so that you may live long and that it may go well with you in the land the LORD your God is giving you.

Deut. 5:17 “You shall not murder.

Deut. 5:18 “You shall not commit adultery.

Deut. 5:19 “You shall not steal.

Deut. 5:20 “You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. 21 “You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife. You shall not set your desire on your neighbor’s house or land, his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.”

Ex. 20:1 And God spoke all these words:

John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning.

John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Gen. 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Heb. 1:1 In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe.

Ex. 20:1 And God spoke all these words: 2 "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. 3 "You shall have no other gods before me.

Deut. 6:13 Fear the LORD your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name. 14 Do not follow other gods, the gods of the peoples around you; 15 for the LORD your God, who is among you, is a jealous God and his anger will burn against you, and he will destroy you from the face of the land.

Ex. 34:14 Do not worship any other god, for the LORD, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God.

John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Matt. 10:34 "Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to bring peace, but a sword. 35 For I have come to turn
"a man against his father,
a daughter against her mother,
a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law—
36 a man's enemies will be the members of his own household.'

Matt. 10:37 "Anyone who loves his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves his son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me;

Luke 14:25 Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them

he said: 26 “If anyone comes to me and does not hate his father and mother, his wife and children, his brothers and sisters—yes, even his own life—he cannot be my disciple. 27 And anyone who does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

Rom. 7:14 We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. 15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16 And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17 As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18 I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19 For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. 20 Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it.

Rom. 7:21 So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. 22 For in my inner being I delight in God’s law; 23 but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members. 24 What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? 25 Thanks be to God—through Jesus Christ our Lord!

So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God’s law, but in the sinful nature a slave to the law of sin.

Rom. 8:1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, 2 because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death. 3 For what the law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the sinful nature, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful man to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in sinful man, 4 in order that the righteous requirements of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the sinful nature but according to the Spirit.

Ex. 34:28 Moses was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights without eating bread or drinking water. And he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant—the Ten Commandments.

Ezek. 36:25 I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your impurities and from all your idols. 26 I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. 27 And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws.
