<u>Rev. 12:9</u> And the great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world — he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

<u>2Cor. 11:14</u> And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.

<u>Matt. 28:18</u> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <u>19</u> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <u>20</u> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and Io, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

<u>Luke 10:27</u> And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." <u>28</u> And he said to him, "You have answered right; do this, and you will live."

Luke 10:29 But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" <u>30</u> Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him, and departed, leaving him half dead. <u>31</u> Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. <u>32</u> So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. <u>33</u> But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was; and when he saw him, he had compassion, <u>34</u> and went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine; then he set him on his own beast and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. <u>35</u> And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.' <u>36</u> Which of these three, do you think, proved neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?" <u>37</u> He said, "The one who showed mercy on him." And Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

<u>Luke 15:11</u> And he said, "There was a man who had two sons; <u>12</u> and the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that falls to me.' And he divided his living between them. <u>13</u> Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took his journey into a far country,

and there he squandered his property in loose living. 14 And when he had spent everything, a great famine arose in that country, and he began to be in want. 15 So he went and joined himself to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed swine. 16 And he would gladly have fed on the pods that the swine ate; and no one gave him anything. 17 But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, but I perish here with hunger! 18 I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; 19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired servants." 20 And he arose and came to his father. But while he was yet at a distance, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. 21 And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet; 23 and bring the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and make merry; 24 for this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to make merry.

Luke 15:25 "Now his elder son was in the field; and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. <u>26</u> And he called one of the servants and asked what this meant. <u>27</u> And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has received him safe and sound.' <u>28</u> But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, <u>29</u> but he answered his father, 'Lo, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command; yet you never gave me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends. <u>30</u> But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your living with harlots, you killed for him the fatted calf!' <u>31</u> And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. <u>32</u> It was fitting to make merry and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.'"

<u>1Cor. 10:13</u> No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

<u>Eph. 6:10</u> Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. <u>11</u> Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. <u>12</u> For we are not contending against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this present darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. <u>13</u> Therefore take the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. <u>14</u> Stand therefore, having girded your loins with truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, <u>15</u> and having shod your feet with the equipment of the gospel of peace; <u>16</u> besides all these, taking the shield of faith, with which you can quench all the flaming darts of the evil one. <u>17</u> And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. <u>18</u> Pray at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,

Matt. 4:4 But he answered, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'"

<u>Matt. 4:7</u> Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'You shall not tempt the Lord your God.'"
