12-207-32 PROMISE OF THE LORD

2:45 Genesis 12:1-7 The call to Abram to go to the land that God will <u>show</u> him. Reference Hebrews 11:8 Abram set out, not knowing where he was going. Reference Genesis 12:7 I will <u>give</u> this land to your offspring.

4:30 Genesis 13:14-17 God again commits the promised land to Abram and his offspring. Teaching on offspring.

7:00 Genesis 17:7-8 The everlasting covenant and a relationship. The land is named Canaan.

9:15 Genesis 26:2-4 God makes substantially the same covenant with Isaac that he made with his father Abraham.

11:10 Genesis 35:9-12 The same covenant established with Jacob. God will be their God and they will be his people. Reference Isaiah 54:5 Your maker is your husband. Jacob is renamed Israel and the same promise is continued – many descendants and a land.

14:05 Deuteronomy 1:8 The promise continues to Moses over 400 years later.

15:45 Psalm 105:7-11 The promise is forever.

18:10 Genesis 17:15-21 The Lord says he will establish the covenant with Isaac not Ishmael.

21:30 Genesis 21:8-14 The separation of Hagar, Abraham, Sarah, Ishmael and Isaac.

24:15 Deuteronomy 4:25-27 Although the Lord gave the land to the Israelites, he set conditions on their ability to stay there.

26:20 Deuteronomy 28:58, 64-67 Teaching about the diaspora of the Jews for failing to keep the Lord's will.

34:30 Jeremiah 23:7-8 The prophet declares that the offspring of the house of Israel shall once again dwell in their own land.

37:25 Jeremiah 30:2-3 The Lord will bring the Israelites back to the land that he gave to their fathers and they will possess it.

38:45 Ezekiel 37:1-14, 21-28 Teaching on the prophecy regarding the spiritual deadness of Israelites and their return to the promised land.

46:55 Revelation 21:1-4, 22-25 Reading

<u>Gen. 12:1</u> Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. <u>2</u> And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. <u>3</u> I will bless those who bless you, and him who curses you I will curse; and by you all the families of the earth shall bless themselves."

<u>Gen. 12:4</u> So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. <u>5</u> And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their possessions which they had gathered, and the persons that they had gotten in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, <u>6</u> Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. <u>7</u> Then the LORD appeared to Abram, and said, "To your descendants I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him.

<u>Heb. 11:8</u> By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place which he was to receive as an inheritance; and he went out, not knowing where he was to go.

<u>Gen. 13:14</u> The LORD said to Abram, after Lot had separated from him, "Lift up your eyes, and look from the place where you are, northward and southward and eastward and westward; <u>15</u> for all the land which you see I will give to you and to your descendants for ever. <u>16</u> I will make your descendants as the dust of the earth; so that if one can count the dust of the earth, your descendants also can be counted. <u>17</u> Arise, walk through the length and the breadth of the land, for I will give it to you."

<u>Gen. 17:7</u> And I will establish my covenant between me and you and your descendants after you throughout their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your descendants after you. <u>8</u> And I will give to you, and to your descendants after you, the land of your sojournings, all the land of Canaan, for an everlasting possession; and I will be their God."

<u>Gen. 26:2</u> And the LORD appeared to him, and said, "Do not go down to Egypt; dwell in the land of which I shall tell you. <u>3</u> Sojourn in this land, and I will be with you, and will bless you; for to you and to your descendants I will give all

these lands, and I will fulfil the oath which I swore to Abraham your father. <u>4</u> I will multiply your descendants as the stars of heaven, and will give to your descendants all these lands; and by your descendants all the nations of the earth shall bless themselves:

<u>Gen. 35:9</u> God appeared to Jacob again, when he came from Paddan-aram, and blessed him. <u>10</u> And God said to him, "Your name is Jacob; no longer shall your name be called Jacob, but Israel shall be your name." So his name was called Israel. <u>11</u> And God said to him, "I am God Almighty: be fruitful and multiply; a nation and a company of nations shall come from you, and kings shall spring from you. <u>12</u> The land which I gave to Abraham and Isaac I will give to you, and I will give the land to your descendants after you."

<u>Is. 54:5</u> For your Maker is your husband, the LORD of hosts is his name; and the Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer, the God of the whole earth he is called.

<u>Deut. 1:8</u> Behold, I have set the land before you; go in and take possession of the land which the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give to them and to their descendants after them.'

<u>Psa. 105:7</u> He is the LORD our God; his judgments are in all the earth. <u>8</u> He is mindful of his covenant for ever, of the word that he commanded, for a thousand generations, <u>9</u> the covenant which he made with Abraham, his sworn promise to Isaac, <u>10</u> which he confirmed to Jacob as a statute, to Israel as an everlasting covenant, <u>11</u> saying, "To you I will give the land of Canaan as your portion for an inheritance."

<u>Gen. 17:15</u> And God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. <u>16</u> I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her; I will bless her, and she shall be a mother of nations; kings of peoples shall come from her." <u>17</u> Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed, and said to himself, "Shall a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Shall Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?" <u>18</u> And Abraham said to God, "O that Ishmael might live in thy sight!" <u>19</u> God said, "No, but Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his descendants after him. <u>20</u> As for Ishmael, I have heard you; behold, I will bless him and make him fruitful and multiply him exceedingly; he shall be the father of twelve princes, and I will make him a great nation. <u>21</u> But I will establish my covenant with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this season next year."

<u>Gen. 21:8</u> And the child grew, and was weaned; and Abraham made a great feast on the day that Isaac was weaned. <u>9</u> But Sarah saw the son of Hagar the Egyptian, whom she had borne to Abraham, playing with her son Isaac. <u>10</u> So she said to Abraham, "Cast out this slave woman with her son; for the son of this slave woman shall not be heir with my son Isaac." <u>11</u> And the thing was very displeasing to Abraham on account of his son. <u>12</u> But God said to Abraham, "Be not displeased because of the lad and because of your slave woman; whatever Sarah says to you, do as she tells you, for through Isaac shall your descendants be named. <u>13</u> And I will make a nation of the son of the morning, and took bread and a skin of water, and gave it to Hagar, putting it on her shoulder, along with the child, and sent her away. And she departed, and wandered in the wilderness of Beer-sheba.

<u>Deut. 4:25</u> "When you beget children and children's children, and have grown old in the land, if you act corruptly by making a graven image in the form of anything, and by doing what is evil in the sight of the LORD your God, so as to provoke him to anger, <u>26</u> I call heaven and earth to witness against you this day, that you will soon utterly perish from the land which you are going over the Jordan to possess; you will not live long upon it, but will be utterly destroyed. <u>27</u> And the LORD will scatter you among the peoples, and you will be left few in number among the nations where the LORD will drive you.

<u>Deut. 28:58</u> "If you are not careful to do all the words of this law which are written in this book, that you may fear this glorious and awful name, the LORD your God,

<u>Deut. 28:64</u> And the LORD will scatter you among all peoples, from one end of the earth to the other; and there you shall serve other gods, of wood and stone, which neither you nor your fathers have known. <u>65</u> And among these nations you shall find no ease, and there shall be no rest for the sole of your foot; but the LORD will give you there a trembling heart, and failing eyes, and a languishing soul; <u>66</u> your life shall hang in doubt before you; night and day you shall be in dread, and have no assurance of your life. <u>67</u> In the morning you shall say, 'Would it were evening!' and at evening you shall say, 'Would it

were morning!' because of the dread which your heart shall fear, and the sights which your eyes shall see.

Jer. 23:7 "Therefore, behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when men shall no longer say, 'As the LORD lives who brought up the people of Israel out of the land of Egypt,' <u>8</u> but 'As the LORD lives who brought up and led the descendants of the house of Israel out of the north country and out of all the countries where he had driven them.' Then they shall dwell in their own land."

Jer. 30:2 "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Write in a book all the words that I have spoken to you. <u>3</u> For behold, days are coming, says the LORD, when I will restore the fortunes of my people, Israel and Judah, says the LORD, and I will bring them back to the land which I gave to their fathers, and they shall take possession of it."

<u>Ezek. 37:1</u> The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD, and set me down in the midst of the valley; it was full of bones. <u>2</u> And he led me round among them; and behold, there were very many upon the valley; and lo, they were very dry. <u>3</u> And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord GOD, thou knowest." <u>4</u> Again he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. <u>5</u> Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. <u>6</u> And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the LORD."

<u>Ezek. 37:7</u> So I prophesied as I was commanded; and as I prophesied, there was a noise, and behold, a rattling; and the bones came together, bone to its bone. <u>8</u> And as I looked, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them; but there was no breath in them. <u>9</u> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, Thus says the Lord GOD: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live." <u>10</u> So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived, and stood upon their feet, an exceedingly great host.

Ezek. 37:11 Then he said to me, "Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. Behold, they say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we

are clean cut off.' <u>12</u> Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I will open your graves, and raise you from your graves, O my people; and I will bring you home into the land of Israel. <u>13</u> And you shall know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves, and raise you from your graves, O my people. <u>14</u> And I will put my Spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you in your own land; then you shall know that I, the LORD, have spoken, and I have done it, says the LORD."

<u>Ezek. 37:21</u> then say to them, Thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I will take the people of Israel from the nations among which they have gone, and will gather them from all sides, and bring them to their own land; <u>22</u> and I will make them one nation in the land, upon the mountains of Israel; and one king shall be king over them all; and they shall be no longer two nations, and no longer divided into two kingdoms. <u>23</u> They shall not defile themselves any more with their idols and their detestable things, or with any of their transgressions; but I will save them from all the backslidings in which they have sinned, and will cleanse them; and they shall be my people, and I will be their God.

<u>Ezek. 37:24</u> "My servant David shall be king over them; and they shall all have one shepherd. They shall follow my ordinances and be careful to observe my statutes. <u>25</u> They shall dwell in the land where your fathers dwelt that I gave to my servant Jacob; they and their children and their children's children shall dwell there for ever; and David my servant shall be their prince for ever. <u>26</u> I will make a covenant of peace with them; it shall be an everlasting covenant with them; and I will bless them and multiply them, and will set my sanctuary in the midst of them for evermore. <u>27</u> My dwelling place shall be with them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. <u>28</u> Then the nations will know that I the LORD sanctify Israel, when my sanctuary is in the midst of them

<u>Rev. 21:1</u> Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. <u>2</u> And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband; <u>3</u> and I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling of God is with men. He will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself will be with them; <u>4</u> he will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain any more, for the former things have passed

away."

<u>Rev. 21:22</u> And I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. <u>23</u> And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine upon it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. <u>24</u> By its light shall the nations walk; and the kings of the earth shall bring their glory into it, <u>25</u> and its gates shall never be shut by day — and there shall be no night there;
