WHAT'S IN A NAME

3:00 Opening remarks of review about Abraham.

4:50 Genesis 17:1 God declares one of his many names - El Shaddai – God Almighty. Teaching on walking with the Lord and what it means to be blameless. Reference 2 Chronicles 16:9

7:35 Genesis 17:2-5 Reading and teaching. Abram gets a new name – “Abraham” - Teaching. Also teaching on the two universal concepts of the Bible. Kingdom and Covenant.

12:15 John 15:16 “You did not choose me, but I chose you...” God initiates and we respond (or maybe we don’t). Teaching on the ways the scripture metaphorically describes God’s relationship to us. Reference Isaiah 54:5 Maker and Husband. Reference Ezekiel 16:1-8 God betrothed himself to his people and they became his.

17:00 Genesis 17:5 Abram’s new name. Teaching. Reference Exodus 6:3 God reveals himself to Abraham as El Shaddai but not as the Lord – (JHWH) Jehovah, or Yahweh. Teaching continues on significance of the Lord’s name being attached to Abraham and Sarah.

24:10 Genesis 17:9-14 Reading and teaching on the covenant and the sign of the covenant – Circumcision and its New Covenant parallel – Baptism.

29:15 Luke 1:59-60 The naming of the child took place at the circumcision. Reference Luke 2:21 Jesus named at circumcision.

31:40 Matthew 1:21 His name will be Jesus, for he will save people from their sins. Reference 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins he is faithful and just and will forgive us.... Teaching. How we rationalize of our sins to avoid confronting them.

36:30 Acts 3:6-9 & 4:7-12 Healing in the name of Jesus.

39:40 Colossians 3:17 Do everything in the name of Jesus, which is presenting ourselves to the Lord – Consecration.

42:25 Philippians 2:5-11 At the name of Jesus every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.....

Gen. 17:1 When Abram was ninety-nine years old the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. 2 And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will multiply you exceedingly." 3 Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 4 "Behold, my covenant is with you, and you shall be the father of a multitude of nations. 5 No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the father of a multitude of nations.

2Chr. 16:9 For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show his might in behalf of those whose heart is blameless toward him. You have done foolishly in this; for from now on you will have wars."

John 15:16 You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide; so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you.

Is. 54:5 For your Maker is your husband, the LORD of hosts is his name; and the Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer, the God of the whole earth he is called.

Ezek. 16:1 Again the word of the LORD came to me: 2 "Son of man, make known to Jerusalem her abominations, 3 and say, Thus says the Lord GOD to Jerusalem: Your origin and your birth are of the land of the Canaanites; your father was an Amorite, and your mother a Hittite. 4 And as for your birth, on the day you were born your navel string was not cut, nor were you washed with water to cleanse you, nor rubbed with salt, nor swathed with bands. 5 No eye pitied you, to do any of these things to you out of compassion for you; but you were cast out on the open field, for you were abhorred, on the day that you were born.

Ezek. 16:6 "And when I passed by you, and saw you weltering in your blood, I said to you in your blood, 'Live, 7 and grow up like a plant of the field.' And you grew up and became tall and arrived at full maidenhood; your breasts were formed, and your hair had grown; yet you were naked and bare.

Ezek. 16:8 "When I passed by you again and looked upon you, behold, you were at the age for love; and I spread my skirt over you, and covered your nakedness: yea, I plighted my troth to you and entered into a covenant with you, says the Lord GOD, and you became mine.

Gen. 17:5 No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the father of a multitude of nations.

Ex. 6:3 I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty, but by my name the LORD I did not make myself known to them.

Gen. 17:9 And God said to Abraham, "As for you, you shall keep my covenant, you and your descendants after you throughout their generations. 10 This is my covenant, which you shall keep, between me and you and your descendants after you: Every male among you shall be circumcised. 11 You shall be circumcised in the flesh of your foreskins, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and you. 12 He that is eight days old among you shall be circumcised; every male throughout your generations, whether born in your house, or bought with your money from any foreigner who is not of your offspring, 13 both he that is born in your house and he that is bought with your money, shall be circumcised. So shall my covenant be in your flesh an everlasting covenant. 14 Any uncircumcised male who is not circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin shall be cut off from his people; he has broken my covenant."

Luke 1:59 And on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child; and they would have named him Zechariah after his father, 60 but his mother said, "Not so; he shall be called John."

Luke 2:21 And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.

Matt. 1:21 she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

1John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Acts 3:6 But Peter said, "I have no silver and gold, but I give you what I have; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." 7 And he took him by the right hand and raised him up; and immediately his feet and ankles were made

strong. 8 And leaping up he stood and walked and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God. 9 And all the people saw him walking and praising God,

Acts 4:7 And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, “By what power or by what name did you do this?” 8 Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, “Rulers of the people and elders, 9 if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a cripple, by what means this man has been healed, 10 be it known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by him this man is standing before you well. 11 This is the stone which was rejected by you builders, but which has become the head of the corner. 12 And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.”

Col. 3:17 And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Phil. 2:5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. 9 Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
