11-157-36 AMOS: GOD SPEAKS TO A SENTIMENTAL AGE (RSV)

:00-3:10 Comments about our "feelings" age and some information on Amos.

3:10 Amos 7:14-15 Amos was a shepherd and a vine dresser, (most likely the owner and not a hired hand. He was educated and his writings are the most polished Hebrew in the Old Testament); but the Lord told him to prophesy to Israel. Reference Amos 3:8. Some history on the divided kingdom. Amos was from the Southern kingdom but his prophesy was to the ten Northern tribes., whose worship center was Bethel.

6:30 Four points to teaching today:

1. To whom much is given, much is required. Teaching.

The Israelites had been given the covenant, but they took it as point of privilege rather than a responsibility for service.

7:40 Amos 3:1-2 Hear this word that the LORD has spoken against you, O people of Israel, against the whole family which I brought up out of the land of Egypt: <u>2</u> "You only have I known of all the families of the earth; therefore I will punish you for all your iniquities. Teaching Privilege and obedience are solidly linked together by God. # 11-157-36 Cont'd

11:15 The privilege to be an American. Teaching on how we have run the same path as the Israelites in moving apart from God. Are we in danger of the word Ichabod appearing over our nation: Inglorious – The Glory has departed.

15:15 **2.** Sometimes trials and calamities are intended to be an occasion for God to speak to us.

Amos 4:6-12 God sent many calamities upon Israel but it did not result in their repentance nor their return to him.

18:30 James 1:2-4 Count it all joy, my brethren, when you meet various trials, $\underline{3}$ for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. $\underline{4}$ And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

Much of the church today s filled with baby Christians who lack maturity.

Learn from Amos and ask what God is trying to teach during times of difficulty. Reference Romans 8:28 Not all things are good but God is able to work for you in the midst of everything, if you let him.

22:20 **3.** When you turn your back on the truth you take a step into darkness. Disobedience is a frightful thing.

24:00 Amos 8:11-12 "Behold, the days are coming," says the Lord GOD, "when I will send a famine on the land; not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD. <u>12</u> They shall wander from sea to sea, and from north to east; they shall run to and fro, to seek the word of the LORD, but they shall not find it. # 11-157-36 Cont'd

The word refused is ultimately removed. Disobedience brings bondage – the unwillingness to act upon that which we know to be true to God's will.

Growth in understanding while remaining stunted in obedience is a perilous condition.

26:20 Jesus makes the same point when he speaks of the unforgivable sin Reference Matthew 12:31-32; Mark 3:28-29; Lk 12:10. Continual denial of the conviction of the Holy Spirit produces a hardened heart and the person is unable to repent. God is always able to forgive, but the person is unable to ask.

28:45 **4.** God will never accept the substitution of religious ceremonies for the practical obedience of his people.

Amos 5:21-24 "I hate, I despise your feasts, and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies. <u>22</u> Even though you offer me your burnt offerings and cereal offerings, I will not accept them, and the peace offerings of your fatted beasts I will not look upon. <u>23</u> Take away from me the noise of your songs; to the melody of your harps I will not listen. <u>24</u> But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.
