## # 06-259-46 LIKE A WIND FROM HEAVEN

- 2:30 Acts 2:1-4 Reading. Teaching on background of Pentecost.
- 3:25 Leviticus 23:15-22 The Feast of Weeks which occurred 50 days after the great feast of the Passover.
- 5:35 Deuteronomy 16:1-2 (Passover), 10 (Weeks), 13 (Booths- Tabernacles), 16-17 (Weeks Greek, Pentecost).
- 7:40 Acts 2:1-4 Teaching. Reference Luke 24:44-49 The worldwide mission that Jesus was assigning to the disciples would require a power beyond human capability.
- 12:45 Acts 1:3-5 The continuation of the dynamic from Luke 24:44-49 during the 40 days after the resurrection. The 40 days was a time for Jesus to teach the disciples what it would mean to live a life under the authority of the Lord. The "Kingdom" of God is the key concept throughout the scripture. Teaching on Kingdom. Reference Matthew 4:17. Kingdom living is that place where your behavior is an authentic living out of the standards established by God. It is living under God's rule and authority. You cannot do it unless you are yielded to the Holy Spirit, for it is He who knows perfectly the will of God at anytime.

- 19:00 John 1:29-34 The Spirit comes upon Jesus as he begins his ministry. Reference Isaiah 11:2, 42:1, 61:1. Reference Acts 10:38 Jesus, anointed with the Holy Spirit and power. Each Christian, has available to him the same opportunity of anointing and power as Jesus had. The disciples are being told that fact, by Jesus directly, here recorded in Acts 1:4-8.
- 24:00 Luke 1:34-38. A reflection on the Christmas celebration. The Holy Spirit will come upon Mary in great power her response is- "May it be to me as you have said." The Easter celebration; focus on the resurrection we too are to experience the resurrection.
- 25:50 Acts 2:2-4 Teaching "filled with the Holy Spirit" Reference John 14:16 and John 16:7 Jesus will leave them physically but will send the Holy Spirit to be with them forever. The same is true for us a God filled life will lead us to that place where we are conformed to the purpose for which he created us (Sanctification).
  - 29:00 Acts 2:4-13 Speaking in other tongues. Teaching.
- 37:00 Further teaching with some focus on the reaction to miracles.
- 41:00 Acts 2:14-15 Peter's response to the comment about the speaking in tongues being an evidence of inebriation. Reference Ephesians 5:18 Do not be drunk...but be filled with the Spirit. Teaching. (There is an audio break at 43:25 but the flow of the teaching is in tact) Reference John 18:17, 25-27 Peter's denials in fear as contrasted to his boldness expressed after Pentecost, as exampled here in Acts 2:14 and following.

- 48:40 Acts 2:17-21 Teaching: Peter communicates the prophecy of Joel. A prophecy where the manifestation of the Spirit begins at Pentecost and continues to enlarge throughout the entire period from then until the second coming.
- 54:15 There is an audio break, sorry. Terry was apparently beginning to speak on the outpouring of the Holy Spirit throughout the world in the 1960's and 70's.
- 1:01 A question for the congregation before the tape ended.

Acts 2:1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. 3 And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Lev. 23:15 "And you shall count from the morrow after the sabbath, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering; seven full weeks shall they be, 16 counting fifty days to the morrow after the seventh sabbath; then you shall present a cereal offering of new grain to the LORD. 17 You shall bring from your dwellings two loaves of bread to be waved, made of two tenths of an ephah; they shall be of fine flour, they shall be baked with leaven, as first fruits to the LORD. 18 And you shall present with the bread seven lambs a year old without blemish, and one young bull, and two rams; they shall be a burnt offering to the LORD, with their cereal offering and their drink offerings, an offering by fire, a pleasing odor to the LORD. 19 And you shall offer one male goat for a sin offering, and two male lambs a year old as a sacrifice of peace offerings. 20 And the priest shall wave them with the bread of the first fruits as a wave offering before the LORD, with the two lambs; they shall be holy to the LORD for the priest. 21 And you shall make proclamation on the same day; you shall hold a holy convocation; you shall do no laborious work: it is a statute for ever in all your dwellings throughout your generations.

Lev. 23:22 "And when you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap your field to its very border, nor shall you gather the gleanings after your harvest; you shall leave them for the poor and for the stranger: I am the LORD your God."

<u>Deut. 16:1</u> "Observe the month of Abib, and keep the passover to the LORD your God; for in the month of Abib the LORD your God brought you out of Egypt by night. <u>2</u> And you shall offer the passover sacrifice to the LORD your God, from the flock or the herd, at the place which the LORD will choose, to make his name dwell there. <u>3</u> You shall eat no leavened bread with it; seven days you shall eat it with unleavened bread, the bread of affliction — for you came out of the land of Egypt in hurried flight — that all the days of your life you may remember the day when you came out of the land of Egypt. <u>4</u> No leaven shall be seen with you in all your territory for seven days; nor shall any

of the flesh which you sacrifice on the evening of the first day remain all night until morning. 5 You may not offer the passover sacrifice within any of your towns which the LORD your God gives you; 6 but at the place which the LORD your God will choose, to make his name dwell in it, there you shall offer the passover sacrifice, in the evening at the going down of the sun, at the time you came out of Egypt. 7 And you shall boil it and eat it at the place which the LORD your God will choose; and in the morning you shall turn and go to your tents. 8 For six days you shall eat unleavened bread; and on the seventh day there shall be a solemn assembly to the LORD your God; you shall do no work on it.

<u>Deut. 16:9</u> "You shall count seven weeks; begin to count the seven weeks from the time you first put the sickle to the standing grain. <u>10</u> Then you shall keep the feast of weeks to the LORD your God with the tribute of a freewill offering from your hand, which you shall give as the LORD your God blesses you; <u>11</u> and you shall rejoice before the LORD your God, you and your son and your daughter, your manservant and your maidservant, the Levite who is within your towns, the sojourner, the fatherless, and the widow who are among you, at the place which the LORD your God will choose, to make his name dwell there. <u>12</u> You shall remember that you were a slave in Egypt; and you shall be careful to observe these statutes.

<u>Deut. 16:13</u> "You shall keep the feast of booths seven days, when you make your ingathering from your threshing floor and your wine press; <u>14</u> you shall rejoice in your feast, you and your son and your daughter, your manservant and your maidservant, the Levite, the sojourner, the fatherless, and the widow who are within your towns. <u>15</u> For seven days you shall keep the feast to the LORD your God at the place which the LORD will choose; because the LORD your God will bless you in all your produce and in all the work of your hands, so that you will be altogether joyful.

<u>Deut. 16:16</u> "Three times a year all your males shall appear before the LORD your God at the place which he will choose: at the feast of unleavened bread, at the feast of weeks, and at the feast of booths. They shall not appear before the LORD empty-handed; <u>17</u> every man shall give as he is able, according to the blessing of the LORD your God which he has given you.

Luke 24:44 Then he said to them, "These are my words which I spoke to you, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, 46 and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, 47 and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 And behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city, until you are clothed with power from on high."

Acts 1:3 To them he presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God. 4 And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me, 5 for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Matt. 4:17 From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

John 1:29 The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! 30 This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, for he was before me.' 31 I myself did not know him; but for this I came baptizing with water, that he might be revealed to Israel." 32 And John bore witness, "I saw the Spirit descend as a dove from heaven, and it remained on him. 33 I myself did not know him; but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' 34 And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."

<u>Is. 11:2</u> And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the

fear of the LORD.

- <u>Is. 42:1</u> Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him, he will bring forth justice to the nations.
- <u>Is. 61:1</u> The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good tidings to the afflicted; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;
- Acts 10:38 how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.

<u>John 16:7</u> Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you.

Acts 2:4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Acts 2:5 Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. 6 And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. 7 And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8 And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? 9 Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, 11 Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." 12 And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" 13 But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."

Acts 2:14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. 15 For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day;

Eph. 5:18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery; but be filled with the Spirit,

John 18:17 The maid who kept the door said to Peter, "Are not you also one of

this man's disciples?" He said, "I am not."

John 18:25 Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. They said to him, "Are not you also one of his disciples?" He denied it and said, "I am not." 26 One of the servants of the high priest, a kinsman of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with him?" 27 Peter again denied it; and at once the cock crowed.

Acts 2:17 'And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; 18 yea, and on my menservants and my maidservants in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. 19 And I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth beneath, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; 20 the sun shall be turned into darkness and the moon into blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and manifest day. 21 And it shall be that whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'
