- :00 This tape was a challenge from an audio quality standpoint. I have done all that I can to make the recording acceptable, but there is still somewhat of a "hollow" tone throughout, sorry.
- 2:15 Acts 2:43-47 Luke uses opportunities to make summary statements of the activities of the early fellowship of believers. Reference Acts 4:32-35; Acts 5:12-15.
- 4:25 Acts 2:43 Teaching on the reaction of many to the manifestation of God's presence.
- 7:50 Acts 2:44-47 Teaching. The believers shared everything they had with those in need. Reference 4:32 No one claimed that any of his possessions were exclusively his own. Not a condemnation of having money or wealth. Reference Deuteronomy 8:17-18 God provides the ability to acquire wealth. The attitude that makes possessions the focus of one's life is the problem. Reference Matthew 19:24 teaching on the eye of the needle and the Camel.
 - 14:45 Acts 2:46-47 Teaching on worshiping at temple.
- 17:00 Acts 3:1-16 Teaching on the nature of the preaching in the book of Acts. Not what Jesus taught, but on the person of Jesus and what he came to accomplish.

- 23:50 1 Samuel 16:6-7 Do not look on the outward appearance...The Lord looks on the heart. Reference John 4:23-24 Worship God in Spirit and Truth. Reference Romans 12:1.
- 27:00 Acts 3:12-16 God glorified his servant Jesus. Reference John 17:4-5 Jesus glorified the Father and the Father glorified the Son. Philippians 2:9-11 God has highly exalted Jesus.
- 34:20 Acts 3:17-18 The Christ was to suffer according to the Father's plan. Reference Luke 24:13-35 Jesus teaches the two on the Emmaus road, all that the Scriptures said concerning himself (verse 27). Teaching A synopsis of the Old Testament references to Jesus.
- 38:50 John 5:37-40, 46-47. Jesus tells the "religious" leaders that to know the Scripture is pointless unless one knows the person whom the scriptures portray and proclaim.
- 40:10 Acts 3:18-19 Teaching on Repentance. Reference Luke 15:11-32. Reference Luke 24:46-47 Repentance and forgiveness. Terry mentioned the last chapter of Acts but it should have been the last chapter of Luke.
- 45:35 Acts 3:19 What is the forgiveness you receive? Two aspects: 1. Justification God declares us not guilty of that which is confessed. 2. God cleanses us.

The condition: 1. Repentance. Reference Romans 3:10; 3:23. Reference Leviticus 16:21-22. Scapegoat.

Repentance is the turning <u>From</u> our human willfulness, emotions and intellect and <u>To</u> the leadership of the Jesus in the person of the Holy Spirit.

49:55 What does the Lord do with our confessed sins. **1**. Isaiah 38:17 – cast your sins behind his back – out of sight. **2**. Psalm 103:12 Removes our sins as far as the East from the West – out of reach **3**. Jeremiah 31:34 God will remember the sins no more – out of his mind.

52:25 Acts 3:19-26 Teaching.

- Acts 2:43 And fear came upon every soul; and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. 44 And all who believed were together and had all things in common; 45 and they sold their possessions and goods and distributed them to all, as any had need. 46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.
- Acts 4:32 Now the company of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things which he possessed was his own, but they had everything in common. 33 And with great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. 34 There was not a needy person among them, for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the proceeds of what was sold 35 and laid it at the apostles' feet; and distribution was made to each as any had need.
- Acts 5:12 Now many signs and wonders were done among the people by the hands of the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. 13 None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high honor. 14 And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes both of men and women, 15 so that they even carried out the sick into the streets, and laid them on beds and pallets, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them.
- <u>Deut. 8:17</u> Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' <u>18</u> You shall remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth; that he may confirm his covenant which he swore to your fathers, as at this day.
- Matt. 19:24 Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."
- Acts 2:46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

Acts 3:1 Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour. 2 And a man lame from birth was being carried, whom they laid daily at that gate of the temple which is called Beautiful to ask alms of those who entered the temple. 3 Seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked for alms. 4 And Peter directed his gaze at him, with John, and said, "Look at us." 5 And he fixed his attention upon them, expecting to receive something from them. 6 But Peter said, "I have no silver and gold, but I give you what I have; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." 7 And he took him by the right hand and raised him up; and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. 8 And leaping up he stood and walked and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God. 9 And all the people saw him walking and praising God, 10 and recognized him as the one who sat for alms at the Beautiful Gate of the temple; and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

Rom. 12:1 I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

Luke 24:13 That very day two of them were going to a village named Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, 14 and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. 15 While they were talking and discussing together, Jesus himself drew near and went with them. 16 But their eyes were kept from recognizing him. 17 And he said to them, "What is this conversation which you are holding with each other as you walk?" And they stood still, looking sad. 18 Then one of them, named Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened

there in these days?" 19 And he said to them, "What things?" And they said to him, "Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, 20 and how our chief priests and rulers delivered him up to be condemned to death, and crucified him. 21 But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since this happened. 22 Moreover, some women of our company amazed us. They were at the tomb early in the morning 23 and did not find his body; and they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. 24 Some of those who were with us went to the tomb, and found it just as the women had said; but him they did not see." 25 And he said to them, "O foolish men, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! 26 Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" 27 And beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself.

Luke 24:28 So they drew near to the village to which they were going. He appeared to be going further, 29 but they constrained him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent." So he went in to stay with them. 30 When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them. 31 And their eyes were opened and they recognized him; and he vanished out of their sight. 32 They said to each other, "Did not our hearts burn within us while he talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the scriptures?" 33 And they rose that same hour and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven gathered together and those who were with them, 34 who said, "The Lord has risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!" 35 Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he was known to them in the breaking of the bread.

John 5:37 And the Father who sent me has himself borne witness to me. His voice you have never heard, his form you have never seen; 38 and you do not have his word abiding in you, for you do not believe him whom he has sent. 39 You search the scriptures, because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness to me; 40 yet you refuse to come to me that you may have life.

<u>John 5:46</u> If you believed Moses, you would believe me, for he wrote of me. <u>47</u> But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe my words?"

Acts 3:18 But what God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ should suffer, he thus fulfilled. 19 Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out, that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord,

Luke 15:11 And he said, "There was a man who had two sons; 12 and the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that falls to me.' And he divided his living between them. 13 Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took his journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in loose living. 14 And when he had spent everything, a great famine arose in that country, and he began to be in want. 15 So he went and joined himself to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed swine. 16 And he would gladly have fed on the pods that the swine ate; and no one gave him anything. 17 But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, but I perish here with hunger! 18 I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; 19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired servants." 20 And he arose and came to his father. But while he was yet at a distance, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. 21 And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet; 23 and bring the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and make merry; 24 for this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to make merry.

Luke 15:25 "Now his elder son was in the field; and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. 26 And he called one of the servants and asked what this meant. 27 And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has received him safe and sound.' 28 But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, 29 but he answered his father, 'Lo, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command; yet you never gave me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends. 30 But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your living with harlots, you killed for him the fatted

calf!' 31 And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. 32 It was fitting to make merry and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found."

<u>Luke 24:46</u> and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, <u>47</u> and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

Acts 3:19 Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out, that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord,

Rom. 3:10 as it is written:

"None is righteous, no, not one;

Rom. 3:23 since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Lev. 16:21 and Aaron shall lay both his hands upon the head of the live goat, and confess over him all the iniquities of the people of Israel, and all their transgressions, all their sins; and he shall put them upon the head of the goat, and send him away into the wilderness by the hand of a man who is in readiness. 22 The goat shall bear all their iniquities upon him to a solitary land; and he shall let the goat go in the wilderness.

<u>Is. 38:17</u> Lo, it was for my welfare that I had great bitterness; but thou hast held back my life from the pit of destruction, for thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back.

<u>Psa. 103:12</u> as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

Jer. 31:34 And no longer shall each man teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

Acts 3:19 Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out,

that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, 20 and that he may send the Christ appointed for you, Jesus, 21 whom heaven must receive until the time for establishing all that God spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old. 22 Moses said, 'The Lord God will raise up for you a prophet from your brethren as he raised me up. You shall listen to him in whatever he tells you. 23 And it shall be that every soul that does not listen to that prophet shall be destroyed from the people.' 24 And all the prophets who have spoken, from Samuel and those who came afterwards, also proclaimed these days. 25 You are the sons of the prophets and of the covenant which God gave to your fathers, saying to Abraham, 'And in your posterity shall all the families of the earth be blessed.' 26 God, having raised up his servant, sent him to you first, to bless you in turning every one of you from your wickedness."
