06-293-46 MAN OF GRACE AND POWER

- 1:30 Acts 6:1-6 Reading. Teaching. The distinction between Disciples and Apostles. We are called to come to Jesus and then he sends us out in the power of the Holy Spirit. It costs nothing to become a Christian (the gift of God's grace for the forgiveness of our sins and the new life) But to follow Jesus costs us everything. Reference Matthew 16:24 Deny yourself and take up your cross.
- 7:45 Matthew 6:33 Seek first the kingdom of God. Establishing a focus upon the priority of your life, seeking God's will for you and living it out. Reference Matthew 7:21 Not everyone who says "Lord, Lord", but the one who does the will of the Father. A daily decision to follow the Lord's will for you brings peace.
- 13:45 Acts 6:1-6 Teaching. Choosing saints for the work of the ministry. Choose those who are full of the Spirit and wisdom. Reference John 3:34 God gives the Spirit without measure. Our willingness to be used and to what level is a decision that rests upon us.
- 21:40 Deuteronomy 34:9 Spiritual wisdom as opposed to human prudence. To be set apart for God's purpose requires the Spirit led life. Reference Isaiah 11:1-3 Spirit of Wisdom. Reference Mark 6:1-3 His own recognized his wisdom.

- 26:50 Acts 6:4-6 The ministry of the Apostles was one of prayer and the proclamation of the word of God. Teaching on Ordination.
- 29:20 1 Timothy 1:18 Paul reminds Timothy of a prophetic prayer that was made sometime earlier about Timothy's ministry. Reference 1 Timothy 4:11-14 Timothy had received confirmation of a gift through a prophecy accompanying prayers and the laying on of hands by the elders. Reference 2 Timothy 1:6 Timothy is encouraged to continue to fan the flame of the gift he received at the laying on of hands.
- 31:50 Acts 13:1-3 The Holy Spirit declared that Barnabas and Saul be set apart; so the Apostles devoted themselves to fasting, prayer and the laying on of hands.
- 34:50 Acts 6:7 The word spread and the family of God grew.
- 35:30 Acts 6:8-15 Teaching on the activity of Stephen. His opponents could not stand up against his wisdom and the power of the Spirit by which he spoke. Reference Luke 21:10-15 The prediction of Jesus about speaking in the power of the Spirit.
- 41:20 John 2:19-21 There is an audio break when Terry was referencing this passage. Reference Acts 6:14 A charge that Jesus will change the "customs" which were handed down from Moses. Reference Matthew 15:1-11 Man's rules in conflict with God's word. Reference 1 Timothy 5:8.

- 49:50 Galatians 4:4-5 Part of Jesus' mission was to bring us out from under the law, especially the religious traditions of men. Reference Ephesians 2:14-15 Jesus abolishes the law.
- 54:15 Matthew 15:10-13 What comes out of a man's mouth determines whether he is clean or not. Only God's plan will survive.
- 1:04:55 Acts 6:11-15 Jesus would change the customs. Reference Acts 7:48. God does not live in houses made by men. Reference 1 Corinthians 6:19 Your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit.

<u>Deut. 34:9</u> And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands upon him; so the people of Israel obeyed him, and did as the LORD had commanded Moses.

Is. 11:1 There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. 2 And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. 3 And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear;

Mark 6:1 He went away from there and came to his own country; and his disciples followed him. 2 And on the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue; and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get all this? What is the wisdom given to him? What mighty works are wrought by his hands! 3 Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him.

<u>1Tim. 1:18</u> This charge I commit to you, Timothy, my son, in accordance with the prophetic utterances which pointed to you, that inspired by them you may wage the good warfare,

<u>1Tim. 4:11</u> Command and teach these things. <u>12</u> Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. <u>13</u> Till I come, attend to the public reading of scripture, to preaching, to teaching. <u>14</u> Do not neglect the gift you have, which was given you by prophetic utterance when the council of elders laid their hands upon you.

2Tim. 1:6 Hence I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you

through the laying on of my hands;

Acts 13:1 Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers, Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Mana-en a member of the court of Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." 3 Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

<u>Acts 6:7</u> And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith.

Acts 6:8 And Stephen, full of grace and power, did great wonders and signs among the people. 9 Then some of those who belonged to the synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called), and of the Cyrenians, and of the Alexandrians, and of those from Cilicia and Asia, arose and disputed with Stephen. 10 But they could not withstand the wisdom and the Spirit with which he spoke. 11 Then they secretly instigated men, who said, "We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God." 12 And they stirred up the people and the elders and the scribes, and they came upon him and seized him and brought him before the council, 13 and set up false witnesses who said, "This man never ceases to speak words against this holy place and the law; 14 for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place, and will change the customs which Moses delivered to us." 15 And gazing at him, all who sat in the council saw that his face was like the face of an angel.

<u>Luke 21:10</u> Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; <u>11</u> there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences; and there will be terrors and great signs from heaven. <u>12</u> But before all this they will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors for my name's sake. <u>13</u> This will be a time for you to bear testimony. <u>14</u> Settle it therefore in your minds, not to meditate beforehand how to answer; <u>15</u> for I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict.

John 2:19 Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will

raise it up." 20 The Jews then said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?" 21 But he spoke of the temple of his body.

Acts 6:14 for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place, and will change the customs which Moses delivered to us."

Matt. 15:1 Then Pharisees and scribes came to Jesus from Jerusalem and said, 2 "Why do your disciples transgress the tradition of the elders? For they do not wash their hands when they eat." 3 He answered them, "And why do you transgress the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition? 4 For God commanded, 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'He who speaks evil of father or mother, let him surely die.' 5 But you say, 'If any one tells his father or his mother, What you would have gained from me is given to God, he need not honor his father.' 6 So, for the sake of your tradition, you have made void the word of God. 7 You hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy of you, when he said: 8 'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; 9 in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the precepts of men.'"
