07-002-46 STEPHEN: SANCTIFIED, STONED

2:00 Review of Acts chapter 6, before beginning chapter 7. Reference Acts 6:8-14.

4:40 Acts 7:1 Stephen is asked to respond to the charges against him.

6:40 Acts 7:1-53 Stephen's method of defense against the charges was to give a history of God and his people and how they were mostly disobedient and resistant to the truth. Preaching in those days usually consisted of telling the story of what God had done. Teaching on Man's relationship to God.

19:45 Genesis 11:31 – 12:3 Abraham is called and God makes a covenant with him.

22:10 Acts 7:6-53 Teaching on the story of the Israelites, Moses and the application to our lives and how God uses us.

33:15 Exodus 3:10 God calls Moses to bring the Israelites out of Egypt. Reference Exodus 4:10-13 Moses' response to God's call. I can't do it, please send someone else.

36:20 Acts 7:44-48 Teaching. Reference 1 Chronicles 17:11-14 A special Son of God, whose kingdom shall last forever.

41:30 Acts 7:46-53 God does not live in houses built by men. He lives in his people. Reference 1 Corinthians 6:19 Your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. Verse 51 tells us that our tendency is to resist the Holy Spirit.

46:00 Acts 7:54-60 The people were furious and stoned Stephen to death. Saul (Paul) was a participant in the killing.

48:10 Questions from the congregation. Some of the questions are hard to hear but the answers usually provide the context. Much on sensing the will of God.

<u>Acts 6:8</u> And Stephen, full of grace and power, did great wonders and signs among the people. <u>9</u> Then some of those who belonged to the synagogue of the Freedmen (as it was called), and of the Cyrenians, and of the Alexandrians, and of those from Cilicia and Asia, arose and disputed with Stephen. <u>10</u> But they could not withstand the wisdom and the Spirit with which he spoke. <u>11</u> Then they secretly instigated men, who said, "We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God." <u>12</u> And they stirred up the people and the elders and the scribes, and they came upon him and seized him and brought him before the council, <u>13</u> and set up false witnesses who said, "This man never ceases to speak words against this holy place and the law; <u>14</u> for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place, and will change the customs which Moses delivered to us."

<u>Acts 7:1</u> And the high priest said, "Is this so?" <u>2</u> And Stephen said: "Brethren and fathers, hear me. The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham, when he was in Mesopotamia, before he lived in Haran, <u>3</u> and said to him, 'Depart from your land and from your kindred and go into the land which I will show you.' <u>4</u> Then he departed from the land of the Chaldeans, and lived in Haran. And after his father died, God removed him from there into this land in which you are now living; <u>5</u> yet he gave him no inheritance in it, not even a foot's length, but promised to give it to him in possession and to his posterity after him, though he had no child. <u>6</u> And God spoke to this effect, that his posterity would be aliens in a land belonging to others, who would enslave them and ill-treat them four hundred years. <u>7</u> 'But I will judge the nation which they serve,' said God, 'and after that they shall come out and worship me in this place.' <u>8</u> And he gave him the covenant of circumcision. And so Abraham became the father of Isaac, and circumcised him on the eighth day; and Isaac became the father of Jacob, and Jacob of the twelve patriarchs.

<u>Acts 7:9</u> "And the patriarchs, jealous of Joseph, sold him into Egypt; but God was with him, <u>10</u> and rescued him out of all his afflictions, and gave him favor and wisdom before Pharaoh, king of Egypt, who made him governor over Egypt and over all his household. <u>11</u> Now there came a famine throughout all Egypt and Canaan, and great affliction, and our fathers could find no food. <u>12</u> But when Jacob heard that there was grain in Egypt, he sent forth our fathers the first time. <u>13</u> And at the second visit Joseph made himself known to his brothers, and Joseph's family became known to Pharaoh. <u>14</u> And Joseph sent and called to him Jacob his father and all his kindred, seventy-five souls; <u>15</u>

and Jacob went down into Egypt. And he died, himself and our fathers, <u>16</u> and they were carried back to Shechem and laid in the tomb that Abraham had bought for a sum of silver from the sons of Hamor in Shechem.

<u>Acts 7:17</u> "But as the time of the promise drew near, which God had granted to Abraham, the people grew and multiplied in Egypt <u>18</u> till there arose over Egypt another king who had not known Joseph. <u>19</u> He dealt craftily with our race and forced our fathers to expose their infants, that they might not be kept alive. <u>20</u> At this time Moses was born, and was beautiful before God. And he was brought up for three months in his father's house; <u>21</u> and when he was exposed, Pharaoh's daughter adopted him and brought him up as her own son. <u>22</u> And Moses was instructed in all the wisdom of the Egyptians, and he was mighty in his words and deeds.

<u>Acts 7:23</u> "When he was forty years old, it came into his heart to visit his brethren, the sons of Israel. <u>24</u> And seeing one of them being wronged, he defended the oppressed man and avenged him by striking the Egyptian. <u>25</u> He supposed that his brethren understood that God was giving them deliverance by his hand, but they did not understand. <u>26</u> And on the following day he appeared to them as they were quarreling and would have reconciled them, saying, 'Men, you are brethren, why do you wrong each other?' <u>27</u> But the man who was wronging his neighbor thrust him aside, saying, 'Who made you a ruler and a judge over us? <u>28</u> Do you want to kill me as you killed the Egyptian yesterday?' <u>29</u> At this retort Moses fled, and became an exile in the land of Midian, where he became the father of two sons.

<u>Acts 7:30</u> "Now when forty years had passed, an angel appeared to him in the wilderness of Mount Sinai, in a flame of fire in a bush. <u>31</u> When Moses saw it he wondered at the sight; and as he drew near to look, the voice of the Lord came, <u>32</u> 'I am the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham and of Isaac and of Jacob.' And Moses trembled and did not dare to look. <u>33</u> And the Lord said to him, 'Take off the shoes from your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy ground. <u>34</u> I have surely seen the ill-treatment of my people that are in Egypt and heard their groaning, and I have come down to deliver them. And now come, I will send you to Egypt.'

<u>Acts 7:35</u> "This Moses whom they refused, saying, 'Who made you a ruler and a judge?' God sent as both ruler and deliverer by the hand of the angel that

appeared to him in the bush. 36 He led them out, having performed wonders and signs in Egypt and at the Red Sea, and in the wilderness for forty years. 37 This is the Moses who said to the Israelites, 'God will raise up for you a prophet from your brethren as he raised me up.' 38 This is he who was in the congregation in the wilderness with the angel who spoke to him at Mount Sinai, and with our fathers; and he received living oracles to give to us. 39 Our fathers refused to obey him, but thrust him aside, and in their hearts they turned to Egypt, 40 saying to Aaron, 'Make for us gods to go before us; as for this Moses who led us out from the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him.' 41 And they made a calf in those days, and offered a sacrifice to the idol and rejoiced in the works of their hands. 42 But God turned and gave them over to worship the host of heaven, as it is written in the book of the prophets: 'Did you offer to me slain beasts and sacrifices, forty years in the wilderness, O house of Israel? 43 And you took up the tent of Moloch, and the star of the god Rephan, the figures which you made to worship; and I will remove you beyond Babylon.'

<u>Gen. 11:31</u> Terah took Abram his son and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and Sarai his daughter-in-law, his son Abram's wife, and they went forth together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go into the land of Canaan; but when

they came to Haran, they settled there. <u>32</u> The days of Terah were two hundred and five years; and Terah died in Haran.

<u>Gen. 12:1</u> Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. <u>2</u> And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. <u>3</u> I will bless those who bless you, and him who curses you I will curse; and by you all the families of the earth shall bless themselves."

<u>Ex. 3:10</u> Come, I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring forth my people, the sons of Israel, out of Egypt."

<u>Ex. 4:10</u> But Moses said to the LORD, "Oh, my Lord, I am not eloquent, either heretofore or since thou hast spoken to thy servant; but I am slow of speech and of tongue." <u>11</u> Then the LORD said to him, "Who has made man's mouth? Who makes him dumb, or deaf, or seeing, or blind? Is it not I, the LORD? <u>12</u> Now therefore go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you shall speak." <u>13</u> But he said, "Oh, my Lord, send, I pray, some other person."

Acts 7:54 Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth against him. 55 But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God; 56 and he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing at the right hand of God." 57 But they cried out with a loud voice and stopped their ears and rushed together upon him. 58 Then they cast him out of the city and stoned him; and the witnesses laid down their garments at the feet of a young man named Saul. 59 And as they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." 60 And he knelt down and cried with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.
