07-035-46 GENTILES GRANTED GRACE

:00-1:00 This recording was a bit of a challenge and the audio sounds a little "hollow", but in order to remove the large amount of background noise I had to edit pretty aggressively.

1:00-7:15 Background and context for the setting in Acts, Chapter 10.

7:15 Acts 10:1-8 Scene 1. Reading and Teaching. Cornelius was a God fearing man; that is a non-Jew who had embraced the God of Israel.

15:25 Acts 10:9-16 Scene 2. Peter's vision

19:20 Acts 10:17-20 The Spirit said to Peter. Teaching.

20:45 1 Corinthians 2:11-13,16 The Spirit which God has given us at rebirth can discern the will of God. Reference 1 Corinthians 3:16 God's Spirit resides in us.

23:50 Acts 10:19-33 Teaching. God takes Peter across a previously forbidden barrier (in the thinking of the Jews), and the Gentile world is about to receive a whole new life. Peter finds himself in the home of a Roman – Soldier – Gentile!

31:20 Acts 10:34-35 God shows no favoritism. A new and profound thought for Peter – A Jew. Reference Matthew

28:19 Go to all nations. Reference Acts 1:6. Reference John 18:36 Kingdom not of this world.

35:05 Romans 5:8-10 God has reconciled to us and solved the Sin issue as to the judgment and any penalty. We need to respond. Being "Saved" has three aspects to it. Past (Penalty for Sin), Present (Power to deal with Sin in the now), Future (Absence of Sin).

40:00 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 God has dealt with the estrangement issue, by reconciling himself to us through his Son. Reference John 14:6.

No universal Salvation, but there is universal possibility.

44:05 Acts 10:36-43 Peter testifies to the good news of Justification, through the death and resurrection of Jesus. He will be the Judge of the living and the dead. Reference John 5:22 Jesus the Judge is also Jesus the Savior.

50:05 2 Corinthians 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

50:40 Acts 10:43 Name of Jesus. Reference Acts 4:12, No other name. Reference Philippians 2:9-11 Name above every name.

51:25 Acts 10:44-45 The Holy Spirit is poured out EVEN on the gentiles. Unthinkable to the Jew.

53:35 1 Corinthians 12:7-11 A list of some of the manifestations of the Holy Spirit which may appear through the people of God when they are yielded.

55:30 Acts 10:46 Speaking in Tongues – Teaching. Reference 1 Corinthians 14:2-3. Prayer to God, not man.

57:10 Acts 10:47-48 After the evidence of the Holy Spirit, Peter decides that they should be baptized in the name of Jesus.

58:10 Acts 11:1-18 Peter has to defend his actions of going to the household of a Gentile, especially since his visit was accompanied by the manifestation of the Holy Spirit.

<u>Acts 10:1</u> At Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion of what was known as the Italian Cohort, $\underline{2}$ a devout man who feared God with all his household, gave alms liberally to the people, and prayed constantly to God. $\underline{3}$ About the ninth hour of the day he saw clearly in a vision an angel of God coming in and saying to him, "Cornelius." $\underline{4}$ And he stared at him in terror, and said, "What is it, Lord?" And he said to him, "Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God. $\underline{5}$ And now send men to Joppa, and bring one Simon who is called Peter; $\underline{6}$ he is lodging with Simon, a tanner, whose house is by the seaside." $\underline{7}$ When the angel who spoke to him had departed, he called two of his servants and a devout soldier from among those that waited on him, $\underline{8}$ and having related everything to them, he sent them to Joppa.

<u>Acts 10:9</u> The next day, as they were on their journey and coming near the city, Peter went up on the housetop to pray, about the sixth hour. <u>10</u> And he became hungry and desired something to eat; but while they were preparing it, he fell into a trance <u>11</u> and saw the heaven opened, and something descending, like a great sheet, let down by four corners upon the earth. <u>12</u> In it were all kinds of animals and reptiles and birds of the air. <u>13</u> And there came a voice to him, "Rise, Peter; kill and eat." <u>14</u> But Peter said, "No, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean." <u>15</u> And the voice came to him again a second time, "What God has cleansed, you must not call common." <u>16</u> This happened three times, and the thing was taken up at once to heaven.

<u>Acts 10:17</u> Now while Peter was inwardly perplexed as to what the vision which he had seen might mean, behold, the men that were sent by Cornelius, having made inquiry for Simon's house, stood before the gate <u>18</u> and called out to ask whether Simon who was called Peter was lodging there. <u>19</u> And while Peter was pondering the vision, the Spirit said to him, "Behold, three men are looking for you. <u>20</u> Rise and go down, and accompany them without hesitation; for I have sent them."

<u>1Cor. 2:11</u> For what person knows a man's thoughts except the spirit of the man which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. <u>12</u> Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit which is from God, that we might understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. <u>13</u> And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual truths to those who possess the Spirit.

<u>1Cor. 2:16</u> "For who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ.

<u>1Cor. 3:16</u> Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?

<u>Acts 10:19</u> And while Peter was pondering the vision, the Spirit said to him, "Behold, three men are looking for you. <u>20</u> Rise and go down, and accompany them without hesitation; for I have sent them." <u>21</u> And Peter went down to the men and said, "I am the one you are looking for; what is the reason for your coming?" <u>22</u> And they said, "Cornelius, a centurion, an upright and God-fearing man, who is well spoken of by the whole Jewish nation, was directed by a holy angel to send for you to come to his house, and to hear what you have to say." <u>23</u> So he called them in to be his guests.

The next day he rose and went off with them, and some of the brethren from Joppa accompanied him. <u>24</u> And on the following day they entered Caesarea. Cornelius was expecting them and had called together his kinsmen and close friends. <u>25</u> When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and fell down at his feet and worshiped him. <u>26</u> But Peter lifted him up, saying, "Stand up; I too am a man." <u>27</u> And as he talked with him, he went in and found many persons gathered; <u>28</u> and he said to them, "You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a Jew to associate with or to visit any one of another nation; but God has shown me that I should not call any man common or unclean. <u>29</u> So when I was sent for, I came without objection. I ask then why you sent for me."

<u>Acts 10:30</u> And Cornelius said, "Four days ago, about this hour, I was keeping the ninth hour of prayer in my house; and behold, a man stood before me in bright apparel, <u>31</u> saying, 'Cornelius, your prayer has been heard and your alms have been remembered before God. <u>32</u> Send therefore to Joppa and ask for Simon who is called Peter; he is lodging in the house of Simon, a tanner, by the seaside.' <u>33</u> So I sent to you at once, and you have been kind enough to come. Now therefore we are all here present in the sight of God, to hear all that you have been commanded by the Lord."

<u>Acts 10:34</u> And Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I perceive that God shows no partiality, <u>35</u> but in every nation any one who fears him and does

what is right is acceptable to him.

<u>Matt. 28:19</u> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

<u>Acts 1:6</u> So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?"

John 18:36 Jesus answered, "My kingship is not of this world; if my kingship were of this world, my servants would fight, that I might not be handed over to the Jews; but my kingship is not from the world."

<u>Rom. 5:8</u> But God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us. <u>9</u> Since, therefore, we are now justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. <u>10</u> For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life.

<u>2Cor. 5:17</u> Therefore, if any one is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come. <u>18</u> All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; <u>19</u> that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. <u>20</u> So we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We beseech you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. <u>21</u> For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

John 14:6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me.

<u>Acts 10:36</u> You know the word which he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace by Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), <u>37</u> the word which was proclaimed throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism which John preached: <u>38</u> how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <u>39</u> And we are witnesses to all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by

hanging him on a tree; <u>40</u> but God raised him on the third day and made him manifest; <u>41</u> not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. <u>42</u> And he commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that he is the one ordained by God to be judge of the living and the dead. <u>43</u> To him all the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

John 5:22 The Father judges no one, but has given all judgment to the Son,

<u>2Cor. 5:21</u> For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

<u>Acts 10:43</u> To him all the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

<u>Acts 4:12</u> And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

<u>Phil. 2:9</u> Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, <u>10</u> that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <u>11</u> and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

<u>Acts 10:44</u> While Peter was still saying this, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. <u>45</u> And the believers from among the circumcised who came with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles.

<u>1Cor. 12:7</u> To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. <u>8</u> To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, <u>9</u> to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, <u>10</u> to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. <u>11</u> All these are inspired by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.

<u>Acts 10:46</u> For they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared,

<u>1Cor. 14:2</u> For one who speaks in a tongue speaks not to men but to God; for no one understands him, but he utters mysteries in the Spirit. <u>3</u> On the other hand, he who prophesies speaks to men for their upbuilding and encouragement and consolation.

<u>Acts 10:46</u> For they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, <u>47</u> "Can any one forbid water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" <u>48</u> And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.

Acts 11:1 Now the apostles and the brethren who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. 2 So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcision party criticized him, 3 saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" 4 But Peter began and explained to them in order: 5 "I was in the city of Joppa praying; and in a trance I saw a vision, something descending, like a great sheet, let down from heaven by four corners; and it came down to me. 6 Looking at it closely I observed animals and beasts of prey and reptiles and birds of the air. 7 And I heard a voice saying to me, 'Rise, Peter; kill and eat.' 8 But I said, 'No, Lord; for nothing common or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' 9 But the voice answered a second time from heaven, 'What God has cleansed you must not call common.' 10 This happened three times, and all was drawn up again into heaven. 11 At that very moment three men arrived at the house in which we were, sent to me from Caesarea. 12 And the Spirit told me to go with them, making no distinction. These six brethren also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. 13 And he told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon called Peter; 14 he will declare to you a message by which you will be saved, you and all your household.' 15 As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell on them just as on us at the beginning. 16 And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he said, 'John baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' 17 If then God gave the same gift to them as he gave to us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could withstand God?" 18 When they heard this they were silenced. And they glorified God, saying, "Then to the Gentiles

also God has granted repentance unto life."
