19-113-47 GOD'S RIGHTEOUSNESS OUR FAITH

- 1:05 Romans 1:16-17 Comments about the move toward worldwide Evangelism among the various Christian denominations, Kairos God's time.
- 10:25 Romans 1:1-4 The Gospel is the person of Jesus Christ and what he accomplished for our sake.
- 11:40 Mark 1:1 The gospel is about what the Father has done for us through Jesus Christ.
- 12:40 Romans 1:17 Teaching. A theme of the scripture is Sin and Righteousness. God is as light. We see our darkness when compared to his righteousness. Reference Isaiah 6:1-5.
- 19:50 Isaiah 64:6 Even our human righteousness is as filthy rags to the Lord. Every person stands before God either in the righteousness God provides in Christ or in their own puny righteousness. Teaching on how God is true to both Justice and Mercy.
- 23:05 Romans 1:17 A righteousness from God is revealed.
- 23:35 Romans 3:19-24 A righteousness from God. Reference Romans 3:10-12.

- 27:35 Matthew 22:11-14. Being clothed in the garment of God. Reference to Psalm 15:1-2
- 29:30 Romans 1:17 The righteousness from God comes through faith. The faith to accept the truth: I can not stand in my own righteousness and I need to receive God's provision. Teaching on faith and belief in the object of your faith.
- 33:00 Teaching on the difference between Christianity and religions of the world.
- 36:45 Romans 3:21-24 Teaching on righteousness through faith.
- 38:25 Philippians 3:7-9 Not a righteousness of my own but that which comes from faith in Jesus Christ.
- 43:45 2 Corinthian 5:21 God's plan for us to stand in his presence. Reference Ephesians 2:8-9.
- 46:15 A call to those who have not yet understood God's invitation and provision.

- Rom. 1:16 I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. 17 For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."
- Rom. 1:1 Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God— 2 the gospel he promised beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures 3 regarding his Son, who as to his human nature was a descendant of David, 4 and who through the Spirit of holiness was declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord.
- Mark 1:1 The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
- All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags; we all shrivel up like a leaf, and like the wind our sins sweep us away.
- Rom. 1:17 For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."
- Rom. 3:19 Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. 20 Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin.
- Rom. 3:21 But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. 22 This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.

Rom. 3:10 As it is written:

"There is no one righteous, not even one; $\underline{11}$ there is no one who understands,

no one who seeks God.

- Rom. 3:12 All have turned away, they have together become worthless; there is no one who does good, not even one."
- Matt. 22:11 "But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes. 12 'Friend,' he asked, 'how did you get in here without wedding clothes?' The man was speechless.
- Matt. 22:13 "Then the king told the attendants, 'Tie him hand and foot, and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'
- Matt. 22:14 "For many are invited, but few are chosen."
- Psa. 15:1 LORD, who may dwell in your sanctuary? Who may live on your holy hill?
- Psa. 15:2 He whose walk is blameless and who does what is righteous, who speaks the truth from his heart

- Phil. 3:7 But whatever was to my profit I now consider loss for the sake of

Christ. 8 What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God and is by faith.

2Cor. 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Eph. 2:8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast.
