19-014-47 NO CONDEMNATION

- 2:40 Romans 8:1-4 Reading. Reference back to Romans 7:14-25. Reference to Old Covenant begun at Genesis 12:2-4 and later added to with Moses Exodus 34:27-28. Leviticus 26:12.
- 7:30 Romans 7:14-25 Teaching. We know that the law is spiritual. God set forth his will for us, that we might have a complete life. The conflict between the spiritual life and the "natural" life.
- 16:40 Romans 8:1 Reading and teaching. Reference Ephesians 1:3-14 Reading and teaching on the Ephesians passage. We have every spiritual blessing and have been adopted into God's family by virtue of our relationship with Jesus.
- 26:25 Romans 8:1 Teaching. Three things God does with our sins. **1**. Cast them behind his back, Isaiah 38:17. Out of sight. **2**. Removes them as far as the East from the West, Psalm 103:12. Out of reach. **3**. I will remember their sin no more. Jeremiah 31:34. Out of memory. Reference 2 Corinthians 5:21.

Teaching on what it means to sin as a believer. Lost fellowship. Like the eclipse of the sun (Son). The sun (Son) hasn't gone anywhere, it's just that something has come between us and the light and the warmth.

- 33:15 Romans 8:2-4 The Spirit set us free. God initiated the plan that allowed us to be reconciled back to him.
- 37:30 Ezekiel 36:26-27 God will give a new Spirit within and the law will be internal. Further he will give the Holy Spirit to enable you to follow the law of your new heart. Reference Matthew 11:30.

Rom. 8:1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, $\underline{2}$ because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death. $\underline{3}$ For what the law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the sinful nature, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful man to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in sinful man, $\underline{4}$ in order that the righteous requirements of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the sinful nature but according to the Spirit.

Rom. 7:14 We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. 15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16 And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17 As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18 I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19 For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. 20 Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it.

Rom. 7:21 So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. 22 For in my inner being I delight in God's law; 23 but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members. 24 What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? 25 Thanks be to God—through Jesus Christ our Lord!

So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in the sinful nature a slave to the law of sin.

Gen. 12:2 "I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you;

I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.

Gen. 12:3 I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

Gen. 12:4 So Abram left, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Haran.

Ex. 34:27 Then the LORD said to Moses, "Write down these words, for in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel."

28 Moses was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights without eating bread or drinking water. And he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant—the Ten Commandments.

Lev. 26:12 I will walk among you and be your God, and you will be my people.

Eph. 1:3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. 4 For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love 5 he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will— 6 to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. 7 In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace 8 that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding. 9 And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, 10 to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment—to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.

Eph. 1:11 In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, 12 in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. 13 And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, 14 who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory.

Is. 38:17 Surely it was for my benefit that I suffered such anguish.

In your love you kept me from the pit of destruction; you have put all my sins behind your back.

Psa. 103:12 as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

Jer. 31:34 No longer will a man teach his neighbor, or a man his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD.

"For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."
