19-097-47 THE GRACE OF GOD

:40 Romans 8:18-27 Reading. Teaching begins with verse 18 – sufferings.

6:20 2 Corinthians 4:8-12 Paul speaks of adversity and suffering.

8:00 Philippians 1:29-30 We have been granted both the grace of believing in Christ and the grace to suffer for him. Reference Romans 8:28.

10:10 Romans 8:19-21 The physical creation itself is under the judgment of the fall.

12:50 Genesis 3:17-19 Because of Adam's (Mankind) sin even the created order is cursed. Reference Genesis 1:28, work itself is not cursed but commanded. Because of the fall, work is often much more difficult than was necessary.

15:50 Romans 8:20-22 Although the natural order is under bondage and decay as the result of the fall, it will be redeemed.

18:55 Jeremiah 12:4 An early description of a parched land.

21:00 Romans 8:23 Even the redeemed groan under the oppression of the fallen world. Reference 1 Corinthians 13:12. We groan, because although our salvation is secure, our sanctification is not complete. Philippians 1:6.

25:30 Romans 8:23-27 We need to wait patiently for all the fruit of our redemption to come forth. We have a sure hope. Sometimes we are not sure of our prayers but, if we are open the Spirit can intercede for us. Teaching – Reference 1 Corinthians 2:10-16. The Holy Spirit within us can let us know what God desires, by discerning "The mind of Christ".

34:00 1 Corinthians 14:2 Speaking to God in tongues – Prayer. Reference 1 Corinthians 14:15 Pray with your spirit and pray with your mind (understanding).

38:35 Romans 8:26-27 Teaching on the limits of human wisdom as it relates to the building of the kingdom. Be open to the Spirit and let him pray through you to the Lord.

<u>Rom. 8:18</u> I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. <u>19</u> The creation waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed. <u>20</u> For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope <u>21</u> that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of the children of God.

<u>Rom. 8:22</u> We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. <u>23</u> Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. <u>24</u> For in this hope we were saved. <u>Phil. 1:29</u> For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for him, <u>30</u> since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have.

<u>Rom. 8:28</u> And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

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1Cor. 2:10 but God has revealed it to us by his Spirit.

The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. <u>11</u> For who among men knows the thoughts of a man except the man's spirit within him? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. <u>12</u> We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God, that we may understand what God has freely given us. <u>13</u> This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, expressing spiritual truths in spiritual words. <u>14</u> The man without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are

spiritually discerned. <u>15</u> The spiritual man makes judgments about all things, but he himself is not subject to any man's judgment:

<u>1Cor. 2:16</u> "For who has known the mind of the Lord that he may instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ.

<u>1Cor. 14:2</u> For anyone who speaks in a tongue does not speak to men but to God. Indeed, no one understands him; he utters mysteries with his spirit.

<u>1Cor. 14:15</u> So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my mind; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my mind.
