### GOD'S UNFAILING WORD

(The teaching is given by H.L. Scott, Associate rector)

2:45 Romans 9:6 It is not as though the word of God had failed...

Three types of people: 1. Those who hope it does fail, 2. Christians who fear that the word might fail, 3. Those who have full confidence in God's word. There is a balance in scripture of Man's choices and God's sovereignty.

7:30 2 Timothy 3:1-5 Read. Reference Romans 3:11-18 Read. Man centered behavior in the last days will result from a lack of fear of God. There can be the pitfall of loving God without the constant understanding that He is God and we are not. If it had not been for His love to us we could have no relationship. We have to understand our place before a Holy God.

11:25 Proverbs 1:1 Read. Teaching. Wisdom is understanding how to live God's way. And the beginning of wisdom is to know what it means to fear God. Living a flippant and casual life with God is to not understand His nature.

14:10 Proverbs 22:6 Train a child vs. teach a child. Training implies enforcement of the teaching.

15:35 Isaiah 55:10-11 Read. Teaching – God's word does not come back to Him void.

18:05 Numbers 23:19 God fulfills his promises. Reference to Galatians 6:7-8 We reap what we sow. Reference Deuteronomy 8:3.

20:40 Proverbs 16:9, 19:21, 21:30-31. Reference Romans 14:11.

24:40 Ephesians 1:11-14 There is an audio break at 27:20 sorry. Rene was teaching on the plan of God for each person's life, and the blessing that follows our obedience to it.

28:05 John 15:16 Do we choose God or does he choose us? Reference Romans 8:38-39. Further we need the continued enablement of the indwelling Holy Spirit to hold us up above a life of disobedience and sin. The good news is that Jesus Christ is Lord.

32:10 Isaiah 6:1-8 When Isaiah encountered the true God he saw his own unworthiness. Reference Job 42:5-6. Reference Luke 5:8. Reference 1 Peter 5:6. Not what we will do for God in our power but what he will do through us in His power.

34:20 Matthew 11:25-26 The God of all chooses to reveal his gracious will and purpose. Reference Romans 8:28.

35:40 Reference to 2 Samuel 15:13-14. David flees from his Son Absalom.

Teaching on responding to God's loving will from the place of knowing fully that He is sovereign and wishes to mature us.

42:05 Philippians 4:4-7 Rejoice in the Lord. We must live with constant awareness that he is the Lord and all is in His control. Peace follows that awareness.

Rom. 9:6 It is not as though God's word had failed. For not all who are descended from Israel are Israel.

2Tim. 3:1 But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. 2 People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, 3 without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, 4 treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God— 5 having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with them.

Rom. 3:11 there is no one who understands,  
no one who seeks God.

Rom. 3:12 All have turned away,  
they have together become worthless;  
there is no one who does good,  
not even one."

Rom. 3:13 "Their throats are open graves;  
their tongues practice deceit."

"The poison of vipers is on their lips."  
14 "Their mouths are full of cursing and bitterness."

Rom. 3:15 "Their feet are swift to shed blood;  
16 ruin and misery mark their ways,  
17 and the way of peace they do not know."  
18 "There is no fear of God before their eyes."

Prov. 1:1 The proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel:

Prov. 22:6 Train a child in the way he should go,  
and when he is old he will not turn from it.

Is. 55:10 As the rain and the snow  
come down from heaven,  
and do not return to it

without watering the earth  
and making it bud and flourish,  
so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater,  
11 so is my word that goes out from my mouth:  
It will not return to me empty,  
but will accomplish what I desire  
and achieve the purpose for which I sent it.

Num. 23:19 God is not a man, that he should lie,  
nor a son of man, that he should change his mind.  
Does he speak and then not act?  
Does he promise and not fulfill?

Gal. 6:7 Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he  
sows. 8 The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will  
reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will  
reap eternal life.

Prov. 16:9 In his heart a man plans his course,  
but the LORD determines his steps.

Prov. 19:21 Many are the plans in a man's heart,  
but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails.

Prov. 21:30 There is no wisdom, no insight, no plan  
that can succeed against the LORD.

Prov. 21:31 The horse is made ready for the day of battle,  
but victory rests with the LORD.

Rom. 14:11 It is written:

“ ‘As surely as I live,’ says the Lord,  
‘every knee will bow before me;

every tongue will confess to God.”

Eph. 1:11 In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, 12 in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. 13 And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, 14 who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God’s possession—to the praise of his glory.

John 15:16 You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit—fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name.

Rom. 8:38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Is. 6:1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. 2 Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. 3 And they were calling to one another:

“Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty;  
the whole earth is full of his glory.”

4 At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

Is. 6:5 “Woe to me!” I cried. “I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty.”

Is. 6:6 Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. 7 With it he touched my mouth and said, “See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for.”

Is. 6:8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"

And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

Job 42:5 My ears had heard of you  
but now my eyes have seen you.

6 Therefore I despise myself  
and repent in dust and ashes."

Luke 5:8 When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!"

1Pet. 5:6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time.

Matt. 11:25 At that time Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. 26 Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure.

Rom. 8:28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

2Sam. 15:13 A messenger came and told David, "The hearts of the men of Israel are with Absalom."

2Sam. 15:14 Then David said to all his officials who were with him in Jerusalem, "Come! We must flee, or none of us will escape from Absalom. We must leave immediately, or he will move quickly to overtake us and bring ruin upon us and put the city to the sword."

Phil. 4:4 Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! 5 Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. 6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all

understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
