11-156-48 FALSE TEACHERS, FOOLISH GALATIANS (RSV)

- :00- Galatians 1:1-6 Comments on the context for Paul's letter. Teaching. Most of Paul's letters contain a prayer for the recipients and thanksgiving for them. Galatians does not have the usual accolade. Contrast Reference Philippians 1:3-6 Paul prays and gives thanks to the Philippians. Reference 2 Thessalonians 1:3
- 4:45 Galatians 1:6-9 Teaching on the diversion from the true gospel, by those in Galatia. The same problem exists today.
- 13:45 Matthew 7:15 "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. 16 You will know them by their fruits. Reference 1 Thessalonians 1:9-10 The fruit of true ministry. Reference Jeremiah 23:16-17 False prophets.

Does the ministry that you sit under turn people from sin to a life of righteous pursuit – sanctification?

18:30 Acts 20:29-30 <u>29</u> I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; <u>30</u> and from among your own selves will arise men speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after them. Teaching.

- 24:20 1 John 4:1-3 False prophets and one test to measure their identity. Reference John 1:1-2,14 The Word is God and he has dwelt among us.
- 29:25 2 John 1:7-11 There will always be those who will deny that God came among us in the flesh.
 - 30:25 Galatians 1:8-9 Teaching.
- 32:45 Galatians 1:10 Am I now seeking the favor of men, or of God? Or am I trying to please men? If I were still pleasing men, I should not be a servant of Christ.

- <u>Gal. 1:1</u> Paul an apostle not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead $\underline{2}$ and all the brethren who are with me, To the churches of Galatia:
- Gal. 1:3 Grace to you and peace from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ, 4 who gave himself for our sins to deliver us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father; 5 to whom be the glory for ever and ever. Amen.
- <u>Gal. 1:6</u> I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and turning to a different gospel —

<u>1John 4:1</u> Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are of God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world. <u>2</u> By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit which confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God, <u>3</u> and every spirit which does not confess Jesus is not of God. This is the spirit of antichrist, of which you heard that it was coming, and now it is in the world already.

<u>John 1:1</u> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God;

<u>John 1:14</u> And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father.
