11-151-48 THE ORIGIN OF PAUL'S MESSAGE (RSV)

- 2:10 Galatians 1:11-24 Reading and teaching.
- 5:15 Galatians 1:1 Paul an apostle not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead.

Paul's message was directed by God himself – Reference Galatians 1:11-12 For I would have you know, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not man's gospel. 12 For I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. Teaching. The ministry of Paul established the framework for the Christian mission. Paul claimed divine revelation was significant in his message.

- 9:50 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 The new covenant Eucharistic language was first put forth by Paul.
- 12:30 1 Corinthians 15:3 Paul delivers the message that he received.
- 13:00 Galatians 1:11-12 Paul makes it clear he is not preaching man's gospel. God sovereignly chose Saul of Tarsus to teach the full gospel message. Teaching on the importance of Paul.

- 16:20 Galatians 1:12It came by revelation of Jesus Christ.... Teaching meaning of revelation in this context. Reference 2 Corinthians 4:5 Jesus Christ as Lord. Reference John 14:26 The Holy Spirit will teach. Reference John 16:14 "take what is mine and show it to you"..... "He will glorify me."
- 19:30 Galatians 1:13-14 Paul's life before Christ. Reference Galatians 1:15-16 Paul refers to his conversion. Reference Galatians 1:17-24 Paul after his conversion. Teaching on the phases. Reference Acts 16:6-10 Paul is directed to bypass Bithynia and go to Macedonia.
- 24:05 Acts 7:51-8:3 Paul (Saul) is introduced in the scripture at the stoning of Stephen.
- 30:45 Galatians 1:15-16 But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, 16 was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood,

Teaching on Paul's capacity to move ahead as an apostle irrespective of his former life. Reference 1 Corinthians 1:26-31. God often chooses unlikely candidates for ministry.

Teaching on Gentiles. Reference Acts 10. Peter and Cornelius.

- 41:00 Teaching on "I did not confer with Flesh and Blood."
- 45:00 Galatians 1:18-19 Teaching on visit to Peter. Teaching on James the Lord's brother. Reference Mark 3:13-19 Teaching – the first list of the 12 apostles. The James in

Galatians is not either James that appears in the Mark list. Reference Mark 6:1-3 James the brother of Jesus.

Acts 16:6 And they went through the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been forbidden by the Holy Spirit to speak the word in Asia. 7 And when they had come opposite Mysia, they attempted to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus did not allow them; 8 so, passing by Mysia, they went down to Troas. 9 And a vision appeared to Paul in the night: a man of Macedonia was standing beseeching him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." 10 And when he had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go on into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them.

Acts 7:51 "You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you always resist the Holy Spirit. As your fathers did, so do you. 52 Which of the

prophets did not your fathers persecute? And they killed those who announced beforehand the coming of the Righteous One, whom you have now betrayed and murdered, 53 you who received the law as delivered by angels and did not keep it."

Acts 7:54 Now when they heard these things they were enraged, and they ground their teeth against him. 55 But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God; 56 and he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing at the right hand of God." 57 But they cried out with a loud voice and stopped their ears and rushed together upon him. 58 Then they cast him out of the city and stoned him; and the witnesses laid down their garments at the feet of a young man named Saul. 59 And as they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." 60 And he knelt down and cried with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

Acts 8:1 And Saul was consenting to his death.

And on that day a great persecution arose against the church in Jerusalem; and they were all scattered throughout the region of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles. 2 Devout men buried Stephen, and made great lamentation over him. 3 But Saul was ravaging the church, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison.

<u>Gal. 1:15</u> But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, <u>16</u> was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood,

<u>1Cor. 1:26</u> For consider your call, brethren; not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth; <u>27</u> but God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise, God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong, <u>28</u> God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, <u>29</u> so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. <u>30</u> He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom, our righteousness and sanctification and redemption; <u>31</u> therefore, as it is written, "Let him who boasts, boast of the Lord."

Mark 3:13 And he went up on the mountain, and called to him those whom he desired; and they came to him. 14 And he appointed twelve, to be with him, and to be sent out to preach 15 and have authority to cast out demons: 16 Simon whom he surnamed Peter; 17 James the son of Zebedee and John the brother of James, whom he surnamed Bo-anerges, that is, sons of thunder; 18 Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Cananaean, 19 and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

Mark 6:1 He went away from there and came to his own country; and his disciples followed him. 2 And on the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue; and many who heard him were astonished, saying, "Where did this man get all this? What is the wisdom given to him? What mighty works are wrought by his hands! 3 Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him.
