JUSTIFICATION BY FAITH (RSV)

:00- Review of some points from earlier teachings in the series, (e.g.) the distinction of Galatians in that it was directed to controversies within the church. It is as relevant today as it was then. Paul asserts his authority and authentication to teach the truth. Reference Galatians 1:1, 11-12.

Teaching on Paul; his spiritual growth, his interaction with the apostles before him etc. Reference Galatians 1:15-17, 18-19, 2: 1-3, 9. Paul's correction of Peter and Barnabas.

12:15 Teaching begins on the main controversy within the body of Christ as exampled in Galatia. "How is a person accepted in the sight of God?" How to overcome the divide of God's holiness and our lack of it – our sinfulness. If it isn't obvious, then perhaps we have never seen a vision of God in his holiness. Reference Isaiah 6:5 Isaiah's response to seeing the Holy God – "Woe is Me."

15:00 Job 4:17 How can man be righteous before God?

15:35 Galatians 2:15-16 We ourselves, who are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners, 16 yet who know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified.

Teaching on being justified in God's sight. The opposite of being condemned. Do not let your view of God's mercy and love, blot out the reality of his holiness.

18:25 Teaching returns to Galatians 2:16 Justification not by the law but by faith in Jesus the Christ. Teaching on the point where Christianity differs from all religions. It is not a matter of what we have done but what God has done.

25:00 A reference to three articles in the Anglican Book of Common Prayer. Article XI – The Justification of Man; Article XII Good Works; Article XIII Works before Justification.

28:45 Teaching continues back at Galatians 2:16-20 Sin, law and faith. In the life of a justified believer, sin breaks not the relationship with God, but the sense of loving fellowship.

33:30 Galatians 2:21 Teaching.

38:00 Terry makes an opportunity for any who wish to receive the Lord Jesus by faith.

- <u>Gal. 1:1</u> Paul an apostle not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead —
- Gal. 1:11 For I would have you know, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not man's gospel. 12 For I did not receive it from man, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. 13 For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it; 14 and I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. 15 But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, 16 was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with flesh and blood, 17 nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me, but I went away into Arabia; and again I returned to Damascus.
- <u>Gal. 1:18</u> Then after three years I went up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas, and remained with him fifteen days. <u>19</u> But I saw none of the other apostles except James the Lord's brother.
- Gal. 2:1 Then after fourteen years I went up again to Jerusalem with Barnabas, taking Titus along with me. 2 I went up by revelation; and I laid before them (but privately before those who were of repute) the gospel which I preach among the Gentiles, lest somehow I should be running or had run in vain. 3 But even Titus, who was with me, was not compelled to be circumcised, though he was a Greek. 4 But because of false brethren secretly brought in, who slipped in to spy out our freedom which we have in Christ Jesus, that they might bring us into bondage — 5 to them we did not yield submission even for a moment, that the truth of the gospel might be preserved for you. 6 And from those who were reputed to be something (what they were makes no difference to me; God shows no partiality) — those, I say, who were of repute added nothing to me; 7 but on the contrary, when they saw that I had been entrusted with the gospel to the uncircumcised, just as Peter had been entrusted with the gospel to the circumcised 8 (for he who worked through Peter for the mission to the circumcised worked through me also for the Gentiles), 9 and when they perceived the grace that was given to me, James and Cephas and John, who were reputed to be pillars, gave to me and Barnabas the right hand of fellowship, that we should go to the Gentiles and they to the circumcised; 10 only they would have us remember the poor, which very thing

I was eager to do.

- Gal. 2:11 But when Cephas came to Antioch I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. 12 For before certain men came from James, he ate with the Gentiles; but when they came he drew back and separated himself, fearing the circumcision party. 13 And with him the rest of the Jews acted insincerely, so that even Barnabas was carried away by their insincerity. 14 But when I saw that they were not straightforward about the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews?" 15 We ourselves, who are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners, 16 yet who know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. 17 But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! 18 But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. 19 For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. 20 I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. 21 I do not nullify the grace of God; for if justification were through the law, then Christ died to no purpose.
- Gal. 3:1 O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was publicly portrayed as crucified? 2 Let me ask you only this: Did you receive the Spirit by works of the law, or by hearing with faith? 3 Are you so foolish? Having begun with the Spirit, are you now ending with the flesh? 4 Did you experience so many things in vain? if it really is in vain. 5 Does he who supplies the Spirit to you and works miracles among you do so by works of the law, or by hearing with faith?
- Gal. 3:6 Thus Abraham "believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." 7 So you see that it is men of faith who are the sons of Abraham. 8 And the scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "In you shall all the nations be blessed." 9 So then, those who are men of faith are blessed with Abraham who had faith.

<u>Is. 6:5</u> And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

<u>Job 4:17</u> 'Can mortal man be righteous before God? Can a man be pure before his Maker?
