12-015-48 TWO SONS AND TWO COVENANTS (RSV)

:00-10:10 General reflections on Galatians and what God had done for mankind to eliminate the estrangement and separation that sin had caused. The Old Testament animal sacrifices were a pre-figuring of the real lamb, that was to come for the atonement of sin. Teaching on the substitutionary atonement. Reference John 17:4 Jesus finished the work the Father had given him.

Teaching on the right view of a truly Holy God. Not presenting an overly sentimentalized view.

10:10 The false teachers wanted to add ceremonial requirements on top of what God had accomplished in Jesus.

12:50 1 Corinthians 1:18 The world considers the gospel to be foolishness. Teaching on the right perspective of good works. Reference Isaiah 64:6 without Christ our righteous acts are as filthy rags to the Lord.

16:00 Galatians 4:21-31 Teaching on the most difficult section of Galatians, and why it is hard to understand. Paul's argument is in three stages: Historical – Allegorical - Personal. Teaching. Reference Galatians 1:6-7, Paul is astonished that the Galatians are straying from the truth. Reference Galatians 3:1 Foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you. Reference Galatians 4:11 I am afraid I have labored over you in vain. Teaching on comparative religions.

24:15 Back to Galatians 4:21-23 Teaching. Historical.

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29:40 Matthew 3:7-9 John challenges the Jewish pride in having Abraham as their father. Sharing the faith of Abraham is the important thing, not the physical bloodline.

31:15 John 8:31-47 Jesus refutes the Jew's appeal to their lineage to Abraham as a foundation for favor with God.

34:55 Galatians 4:22-23 Teaching on the sons of Abraham. History,

40:20 Galatians 4:24-26 The allegory. Teaching. The covenants. One of law and slavery; one of promise and freedom.

"Cast out the slave and her son; for the son of the slave shall not inherit with the son of the free woman." 31 So, brethren, we are not children of the slave but of the free woman.

<u>Gal. 1:6</u> I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and turning to a different gospel — $\underline{7}$ not that there is another gospel, but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ.

<u>Gal. 3:1</u> O foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was publicly portrayed as crucified?

Gal. 4:11 I am afraid I have labored over you in vain.

Gal. 4:21 Tell me, you who desire to be under law, do you not hear the law?

<u>22</u> For it is written that Abraham had two sons, one by a slave and one by a free woman. <u>23</u> But the son of the slave was born according to the flesh, the son of the free woman through promise.

<u>Matt. 3:7</u> But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? <u>8</u> Bear fruit that befits repentance, <u>9</u> and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.

<u>John 8:39</u> They answered him, "Abraham is our father." Jesus said to them, "If you were Abraham's children, you would do what Abraham did, <u>40</u> but now you seek to kill me, a man who has told you the truth which I heard from God; this is not what Abraham did. <u>41</u> You do what your father did." They said to him, "We were not born of fornication; we have one Father, even God." <u>42</u> Jesus said to them, "If God were your Father, you would love me, for I proceeded and came forth from God; I came not of my own accord, but he sent me. <u>43</u> Why do you not understand what I say? It is because you cannot bear to hear my word. <u>44</u> You are of your father the devil, and your will is to do your father's desires. He was a murderer from the beginning, and has nothing to do with the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks according to his own nature, for he is a liar and the father of lies. <u>45</u> But, because I tell the truth, why do you not believe me? <u>47</u> He who is of God hears the words of God; the reason why you do not hear them is that you are not of God."
