- 1:30 2 Timothy 3:16-17 <u>16</u> All scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, <u>17</u> that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
- 2:10 Comments on the nature of the final chapter of Galatians.
- 3:10 Galatians 6:6-10 Reading. Focus upon verse 7. Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. Teaching.

**Command**: Do not be deceived

The Statement: God is not mocked

The Principle: for whatever a man sows, that he will also

reap.

5:25 Galatians 6:7 Do Not be deceived. The reason man is so easily deceived is because he has practiced Self-Deception in his own life: Rationalization and justification. Further, much of life is filled with deceptions from others. Then there is the fact that among us is the 'father of lies" Reference John 8:44 You are of your father the devil, and your will is to do your father's desires. He was a murderer from the beginning, and has nothing to do with the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks according to his own nature, for he is a liar and the father of lies. Reference Revelation 12:9 ...The deceiver of the whole world.... Teaching on deception.

God wants to deal with us on the basis of truth; light not darkness. Reference 1 John 1:6.

- 10:05 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Teaching if we are really going to deal with God we need to move out of the shadows and into the light.
- 12:00 Galatians 6:7 .... for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. Teaching a universal principle true in the natural order, the moral order and in the spiritual realm. Teaching on "Uniformity".
- 15:30 Genesis 8:22 While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."
- 17:10 Job 4:8 As I have seen, those who plow iniquity and sow trouble reap the same. Teaching. God established the link between sowing and reaping.
- 18:40 Hosea 8:7 For they sow the wind, and they shall reap the whirlwind. Teaching. Reference Hosea 8:1 Set the trumpet to your lips, for a vulture is over the house of the LORD, because they have broken my covenant, and transgressed my law. Question: Are there vultures over our house?

- 23:45 Luke 10:1-7 Jesus sends 70 to go out two by two and says that the laborers deserve their wages verse 7. Teaching.
- 25:40 1 Corinthians 9:3-12 Reading and teaching on the justification for those who teach the word to derive a living from that endeavor.
- 29:40 Galatians 6:6 Let him who is taught the word share all good things with him who teaches. Teaching continues on sharing.
- 30:20 Galatians 6:8 For he who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption; but he who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. Teaching. We sow a thought and reap an act; We sow an act and reap a habit; We sow a habit and reap a character; We sow a character and reap a destiny. Reference Philippians 4:8

- Luke 10:1 After this the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come. 2 And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. 3 Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. 4 Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road. 5 Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' 6 And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you. 7 And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages; do not go from house to house.

Who plants a vineyard without eating any of its fruit? Who tends a flock without getting some of the milk?
- 1Cor. 9:8 Do I say this on human authority? Does not the law say the same? 9 For it is written in the law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it is treading out the grain." Is it for oxen that God is concerned? 10 Does he not speak entirely for our sake? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of a share in the crop. 11 If we have sown spiritual good among you, is it too much if we reap your material benefits? 12 If others share this rightful claim upon you, do not we

## still more?

Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the gospel of Christ.

<u>Gal. 6:8</u> For he who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption; but he who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.

<u>Phil. 4:8</u> Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.

<u>Gal. 6:9</u> And let us not grow weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap, if we do not lose heart. <u>10</u> So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all men, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.
