1:25 Galatians 6:17-18 Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. <u>18</u> The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

Teaching on the reasons why people oppose the concept of God's grace, and how it impacts the broken relationship between God and his creation.

3:10 Grace vs. works. Christianity vs. all other forms of "Religion". Teaching. Some comments about Socrates. Earning "Salvation" by man is impossible. Everything that makes salvation possible has already been done by God himself, through Jesus Christ. Reference John 10:17-18 Jesus laid down his own life of his own accord.

7:00 Teaching on the root problem that motivated Paul to combat the false teaching going on in Galatia. Man trying to establish his own basis for justification. That tendency toward self-justification is still present in religious society today.

9:00 Matthew 15:9 in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the precepts of men.

Teaching – Grace: is the unmerited, undeserved favor of God toward us. Reference Ephesians 2:8-9 Even the faith to accept God's grace is itself a gift.

12:00 Romans 16:25-27 Paul calls for the obedience of faith, not obedience of works, as it relates to salvation. A laying

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hold of what God has done on our behalf.

13:20 1 Corinthians 16:23-24 Grace be with you.

13:35 2 Corinthians 13:14 The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

13:55 Galatians 6:18 The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

Reference Galatians 1:13-15 For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it; <u>14</u> and I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. <u>15</u> But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace,

18:35 Teaching on God's forgiveness. God treats our sins in many ways: He casts them behind his back (Out of his sight) Isaiah 38:17; He separates them as the East is from the West (Out of reach) Psalm 103:12; He will remember our sins no more, (Out of his mind) Jeremiah 31:34, Hebrews 8:12, Hebrews 10:17.

Teaching – the evil one is the accuser of the brethren Reference Revelation 12:10.

20:30 Romans 15:15-16 But on some points I have written to you very boldly by way of reminder, because of the grace given me by God <u>16</u> to be a minister of Christ Jesus to the Gentiles in the priestly service of the gospel of God, so that the offering of the Gentiles may be acceptable, sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

Paul the great apostle to the gentiles through God's grace.

22:20 Ephesians 3:1 Paul understood that even his incarceration was a part of what God had for him. Much false gospel is being preached today. Teaching. John 16:33 Jesus

said that "in the world you will have tribulation" – so why are we surprised when we face it. Reference Philippians 1:29 For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake,

24:25 Ephesians 3:2 assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you,

All of us have a stewardship of God's grace and we are called to export it to others.

Ephesians 3:3-11 Paul sets forth his ministry made possible through the mighty Grace of God.

26:30 2 Timothy 1:8-12 Reading. Paul was willing to accept the suffering that would come upon him as a result of his faithful proclamation of the gospel. Reference Galatians 6:17 Paul alludes to the marks of suffering upon his physical body. Reference 2 Corinthians 11:23-29 A sample of the sufferings of Paul. Reference Philippians 4:12-13 Paul learned to accept the bad along with the good.

29:00 Terry appeals to the congregation to accept the calling of God upon their lives – in total service.

30:10 1 Corinthians 15:9-10a 10a But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. Teaching – Terry asks the congregation to personalize the verse and take an audit of their response to God's grace. Is God's grace towards you in vain?

31:20 1 Corinthians 15:10b On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God which is with me. Teaching - Paul was very aware that the grace of God was his source. Teaching – we also can do great things for God.

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Terry offers opportunity for the people to give their lives to the Lord. <u>Eph. 3:1</u> For this reason I, Paul, a prisoner for Christ Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles — $\underline{2}$ assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you, $\underline{3}$ how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly. $\underline{4}$ When you read this you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, $\underline{5}$ which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit; $\underline{6}$ that is, how the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Eph. 3:7 Of this gospel I was made a minister according to the gift of God's

grace which was given me by the working of his power. <u>8</u> To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, <u>9</u> and to make all men see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; <u>10</u> that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the principalities and powers in the heavenly places. <u>11</u> This was according to the eternal purpose which he has realized in Christ Jesus our Lord,

<u>2Tim. 1:8</u> Do not be ashamed then of testifying to our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel in the power of God, <u>9</u> who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not in virtue of our works but in virtue of his own purpose and the grace which he gave us in Christ Jesus ages ago, <u>10</u> and now has manifested through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. <u>11</u> For this gospel I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, <u>12</u> and therefore I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me.

<u>Gal. 6:17</u> Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus.

<u>2Cor. 11:23</u> Are they servants of Christ? I am a better one — I am talking like a madman — with far greater labors, far more imprisonments, with countless beatings, and often near death. <u>24</u> Five times I have received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. <u>25</u> Three times I have been beaten with rods; once I was stoned. Three times I have been shipwrecked; a night and a day I have been adrift at sea; <u>26</u> on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brethren; <u>27</u> in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure. <u>28</u> And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure upon me of my anxiety for all the churches. <u>29</u> Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to fall, and I am not indignant?

<u>Phil. 4:12</u> I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound; in any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger,

abundance and want. 13 I can do all things in him who strengthens me.

<u>1Cor. 15:9</u> For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <u>10</u> But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God which is with me.
