CREATED FOR GOOD WORKS

3:30 Ephesians 2:10 God began working in our lives long before we accepted him. He prepared and equipped us for good works that he had in mind, for us to accomplish. He has a Plan and purpose for our life. Whether we seek out that plan, is a matter for us decide. Free will allows us to disown any interest in seeking out what the plan is.

12:40 Exodus 3:10 The Lord calls Moses to a job, (his plan for Moses).

Exodus 4:10 Moses tries to refuse the call, by saying he is not up to the task.

Exodus 4:11 The Lord responds by telling Moses that He Himself (the Lord) will enable Moses to accomplish the purpose. When God calls he Equips.

18:30 Jeremiah 1:5-6 The great prophet tries to refuse the call of God, much in the same manner as Moses did.

Jeremiah 1:7-8 The Lord affirms that he will enable Jeremiah to accomplish His plan and purpose.

19:00 → end. Do we understand that God has a plan and purpose for our lives as spoken of in Ephesians 2:10 ? The

focus of each of us should be the discovery of God's plan and the purpose for our life. The discovery of and the implementation of that plan will bring ultimate fulfillment in our life. Further, our working out of God's plan for our life will bring blessing to others AND Glory to God.

Eph. 2:10 For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Ex. 3:10 So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."

Ex. 4:10 Moses said to the LORD, "O Lord, I have never been eloquent, neither in the past nor since you have spoken to your servant. I am slow of speech and tongue."

Ex. 4:11 The LORD said to him, "Who gave man his mouth? Who makes him deaf or mute? Who gives him sight or makes him blind? Is it not I, the LORD?"

Jer. 1:5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

Jer. 1:6 "Ah, Sovereign LORD," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am only a child."

Jer. 1:7 But the LORD said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a child.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. 8 Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the LORD.
