Ephesians 4:24-28

WALKING IN THE LIGHT

3:50 He paid a debt he did not owe, I owed a debt I could not pay.

5:00 God (Bible), always tries to connect belief with behavior. So when a person's behavior does not reflect their belief they are trying to separate what God has joined together.

6:20 Sanctification – making our outward and inner life correspond to what God has done for us.

9:00 Jeremiah 18 – A timely message for our personal life and the life of our nation. The vessel of your life may be marred, but like the potter, God can stop the destruction and remold a new vessel if you stay pliable and don't harden up. Putting off the old life and putting on the new.

13:40 Ephesians 4:25 – Each person should put off falsehood and speak truthfully..... A beginning step toward sanctification. Spiritual high moments are like filling stations – they are not to be the destination, rather they are to fill us so that we can go forth to practical action on God's behalf.

24:00 A story about a Nun who was distressed that God was always watching her.

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28:00 Ephesians 4: 26-27 – In your anger do not sin. Anger often produces bitterness and resentment and they are the foothold for the devil. Bitterness and resentment will eat you up. Better to pray for God's mercy for the offender, and offer your own forgiveness as a demonstration that you are a new person in Christ.

41:00 Ephesians 4:29-32 – Do not let unwholesome talk come from your lips, but build others up. Get rid of bitterness and its cousins and forgive as God has forgiven you.

Eph. 4:24 and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

Eph. 4:25 Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor, for we are all members of one body. 26 “In your anger do not sin”: Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, 27 and do not give the devil a foothold. 28 He who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with his own hands, that he may have something to share with those in need.

Jer. 18:1 This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD: 2 “Go down to the potter’s house, and there I will give you my message.” 3 So I went down to the potter’s house, and I saw him working at the wheel. 4 But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him.

Jer. 18:5 Then the word of the LORD came to me: 6 “O house of Israel, can I not do with you as this potter does?” declares the LORD. “Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, O house of Israel. 7 If at any time I announce that a nation or kingdom is to be uprooted, torn down and destroyed, 8 and if that nation I warned repents of its evil, then I will relent and not inflict on it the disaster I had planned. 9 And if at another time I announce that a nation or kingdom is to be built up and planted, 10 and if it does evil in my sight and does not obey me, then I will reconsider the good I had intended to do for it.

Jer. 18:11 “Now therefore say to the people of Judah and those living in Jerusalem, ‘This is what the LORD says: Look! I am preparing a disaster for you and devising a plan against you. So turn from your evil ways, each one of you, and reform your ways and your actions.’ 12 But they will reply, ‘It’s no use. We will continue with our own plans; each of us will follow the stubbornness of his evil heart.’”

Eph. 4:29 Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. 30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. 31 Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. 32 Be

kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.
