BONDS, BARRIERS, AND BODIES (RSV)

- 2:15 Philippians 1:12 I want you to know, brethren, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, Teaching on Paul's tribulations for proclaiming the gospel. Reference Acts 28:16 Paul's "House Arrest". Paul looks at his circumstances with a Godly perspective, not a complaining one. Reference Romans 8:28 Paul's assurance. Teaching on loving God and walking according to his purpose.
- 8:00 An example Joseph. Teaching. Reference Genesis 50:20 "You meant evil against me; but God meant it for good. Another example: The crucifixion man at his worst became the occasion for God's plan of salvation.
- 10:50 Philippians 1:13 Paul's ministry spread throughout the praetorian guard. Teaching. Reference Acts 28:30-31,23
- 13:20 Philippians 1:14 Paul's chains became a medicine of courage to some of the other Christians. Teaching.
- 14:05 Philippians 1:15-18 Motivation for preaching Christ Teaching. The love of Christ or self advancement. Reference 1 Corinthians 1:23.
- 17:35 Philippians 1:19-20 Paul looks to the prayers of the Philippians and the Spirit of Jesus Christ. No matter what happens, Christ will be honored.

- Phil. 1:12 I want you to know, brethren, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel,
- Acts 28:16 And when we came into Rome, Paul was allowed to stay by himself, with the soldier that guarded him.
- Rom. 8:28 We know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose.
- Gen. 50:20 As for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today.
- <u>Phil. 1:13</u> so that it has become known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ;
- Acts 28:30 And he lived there two whole years at his own expense, and welcomed all who came to him, 31 preaching the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ quite openly and unhindered.
- Acts 28:23 When they had appointed a day for him, they came to him at his lodging in great numbers. And he expounded the matter to them from morning till evening, testifying to the kingdom of God and trying to convince them about Jesus both from the law of Moses and from the prophets.
- <u>Phil. 1:14</u> and most of the brethren have been made confident in the Lord because of my imprisonment, and are much more bold to speak the word of God without fear.
- <u>Phil. 1:15</u> Some indeed preach Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from good will. <u>16</u> The latter do it out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel; <u>17</u> the former proclaim Christ out of partisanship, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment. <u>18</u> What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and in that I rejoice.
- <u>Phil. 1:19</u> Yes, and I shall rejoice. For I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, <u>20</u> as it is my eager expectation and hope that I shall not be at all ashamed, but that with

full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death.
