## # 09-035-50 COPING THROUGH CONTENTMENT (RSV)

- :00-2:25 Snapshot of the background from which Paul wrote the letter to the Philippians.
- 2:25 Philippians 4:10 I rejoice in the Lord greatly that now at length you have revived your concern for me; you were indeed concerned for me, but you had no opportunity.

Paul had a special affection for those in Phillipi. Reference Philippians 1:3-8 Philippians supported Paul. Reference Philippians 4:14-16

Teaching. Some comments contrary to the popular "prosperity gospel" teaching coming from some Christian groups. Teaching – the Christian life does not provide an escape from problems. Paul knows how to live in any circumstances. No resentment, no bitterness.

- 10:40 Luke 12:15 And he said to them, "Take heed, and beware of all covetousness; for a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." Teaching.
- 11:30 Ecclesiastes 3:11 .... God has put eternity into man's mind, .... Teaching God has made it so, that man cannot find permanent satisfaction in earthly, fleshly, things.
- 12:45 Philippians 4:11 "Content" (Greek autarkes G0842) Only use of the word in scripture. Terry teaches on Paul's concept of being "content" in contrast to the Greek philosophical views in Stoicism (kill every desire and kill every

- feeling). Paul had confidence in God, deep feelings of love, and strong desires to advance the kingdom.
- 17:55 Philippians 1:21 For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. For Paul, Jesus was the foundation of his life; the goal of his life; and the measure by which he evaluated things in life. He saw Jesus as the source of his ambition for life.
- 18:00 Philippians 2:5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, Teaching.
- 18:45 Philippians 3:8 Indeed I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as refuse, in order that I may gain Christ. Teaching. Reference Matthew 6:33-34. Priorities Put God first then life will take its rightful place. Teaching.
- 20:20 Philippians 3:14 I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.
- 21:00 Romans 8:28 We know that in everything God works for good with those who love him, who are called according to his purpose. Teaching the story regarding Joseph Reference Genesis 50:20 Man did it for evil, but God brought good out of it. Reference the crucifixion of Jesus. Out of the wickedness of man God brought redemption and life.
- 24:55 1 Thessalonians 5:18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Teaching.
- 25:40 James 1:2-4 Count it all joy, my brethren, when you meet various trials, <u>3</u> for you know that the testing of your

faith produces steadfastness.  $\underline{4}$  And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

25:55 Philippians 4:13 I can do all things in him who strengthens me. Teaching. Not invincibility but strength to endure whatever comes your way.

- <u>Phil. 4:10</u> I rejoice in the Lord greatly that now at length you have revived your concern for me; you were indeed concerned for me, but you had no opportunity.
- Phil. 1:3 I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, 4 always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, 5 thankful for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. 6 And I am sure that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. 7 It is right for me to feel thus about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all partakers with me of grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. 8 For God is my witness, how I yearn for you all with the affection of Christ Jesus.
- <u>Phil. 4:14</u> Yet it was kind of you to share my trouble. <u>15</u> And you Philippians yourselves know that in the beginning of the gospel, when I left Macedonia, no church entered into partnership with me in giving and receiving except you only; 16 for even in Thessalonica you sent me help once and again.
- <u>Luke 12:15</u> And he said to them, "Take heed, and beware of all covetousness; for a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."
- Eccl. 3:11 He has made everything beautiful in its time; also he has put eternity into man's mind, yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end.
- Phil. 4:11 Not that I complain of want; for I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content.
