11-033-51 THE PRE-EMINENT CHRIST (RSV)

1:30 There are 3294 questions asked in the bible. 2272 in the Old Testament and 1,022 in the New Testament. Matthew 22:42 Jesus asks the question. "What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is He? Reference Acts 22:8,10 Who are you Lord? What shall I do?

3:00 Colossians 1:15 He is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of all creation; Reference John 1:18, John 6:46; 1 John 4:12, 1 John 4:20 No one has seen God.

4:10 Hebrews 1:1-2 In the past God spoke through the prophets, but now speaks by his Son. Our living God speaks. The true God is not the product of human intellection. God is the grand pre-supposition of all creation. Reference John 1:1-2, 14 The Word is eternal and came to dwell among us.

7:50 Colossians 1:15 Teaching. God's final revelation to us is not a theology, or a teaching, or an idea, nor a principal, or a philosophy – but a person. Reference John 14:9 He who has seen me has seen the Father. John 10:30 I and the Father are one. John 8:58 Before Abraham was, I am.

10:20 Colossians 1:15 "the first-born of all creation" Teaching on the "New Creation" ushered in by the Christ.

11:25 Colossians 1:16 for in him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones

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or dominions or principalities or authorities — all things were created through him and for him. Teaching Reference Hebrews 11:3 God created by his word/Word. With reference to Christ all things were created – In him, through him and for him, so if you try and live apart from Christ you are cutting off the source of your being. The reason you exist, is for Jesus Christ. Reference John 1:1-3 The Christ – Word – and creation. Reference Hebrews 1:1-2.

18:15 Colossians 1:17 He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. The Word/word is eternal with the Father and the Spirit. Reference Micah 5:2 His origin is from ancient days. Reference Isaiah 9:6 Mighty God, Everlasting Father. Reference Revelation 13:8 The Lamb slain from the creation of the world. Teaching " all things hold together."

21:15 Colossians 1:18 And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. Reference 1 Corinthians 6:19 God within. In a sense the Body of Christ (the church) is an extension of the incarnation.
