10-158-53 GOD'S RIGHTEOUS JUDGMENT
(RSV)

8:10 2 Thessalonians 1:4-5 Reading. The fact that the Thessalonians could bear up under the persecutions was evidence that God had them in his kingdom.

9:30 Psalm 13:1-2 The Psalmist asks "How long" will it be before the Lord corrects the wrongs of the world. Reference Revelation 6:9-10 How long Lord before you will judge?

10:45 Teaching. Our attitude in response to unfortunate circumstances and even injustices should be one of endurance and non-complaint. God notices. They are preparation for further kingdom work.

12:25 John 16:33 Jesus warned of tribulation in the world. Reference Philippians 1:29 For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake,

12:50 2 Timothy 3:12-13 Indeed all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, 13 while evil men and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceivers and deceived. Teaching on the trials of life.

14:00 Isaiah 43:2 When you pass through the waters I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

15:00 James 1:2-4 Count it all joy, my brethren, when you meet various trials, 3 for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. 4 And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. Teaching – Satan wants us to complain against God, but God wants us to allow him to strengthen our steadfastness.

18:45 Teaching – Ultimately judgment will come and the righteous will be vindicated.

19:50 2 Thessalonians 1:6 Teaching about vengeance. Reference Romans 12:17-19,21. Do not take vengeance into your own hands.

21:10 2 Thessalonians 1:7-8 Teaching - the age of Grace (the year of the Lord's favor, Reference Isaiah 61:2) and the coming judgment. There can come a time when a person's heart is so hardened that they are unable to repent. Teaching – There will come a time when everything is revealed as it truly is.

27:00 2 Thessalonians 1:9 Teaching – The great irony: Hell is exactly what the people wished for- a place without any reference to God.

30:40 2 Thessalonians 1:10-12 We are to let the Holy Spirit perfect us. Progressive holiness - Sanctification. Will we reflect the glory of God. Reference Matthew 5:16.

2Th. 1:4 Therefore we ourselves boast of you in the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith in all your persecutions and in the afflictions which you are enduring.

2Th. 1:5 This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be made worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are suffering —

Psa. 13:1 How long, O LORD? Wilt thou forget me for ever? How long wilt thou hide thy face from me? 2 How long must I bear pain in my soul, and have sorrow in my heart all the day? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?

Rev. 6:9 When he opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne; 10 they cried out with a loud voice, “O Sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long before thou wilt judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell upon the earth?”

John 16:33 I have said this to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.”

Phil. 1:29 For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake,

2Tim. 3:12 Indeed all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, 13 while evil men and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceivers and deceived.

2Th. 1:6 since indeed God deems it just to repay with affliction those who afflict you,

Rom. 12:17 Repay no one evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. 18 If possible, so far as it depends upon you, live peaceably with all. 19 Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." 20 No, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head." 21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

2Th. 1:7 and to grant rest with us to you who are afflicted, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in flaming fire, 8 inflicting vengeance upon those who do not know God and upon those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. 9 They shall suffer the punishment of eternal destruction and exclusion from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might, 10 when he comes on that day to be glorified in his saints, and to be marveled at in all who have believed, because our testimony to you was believed. 11 To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his call, and may fulfil every good resolve and work of faith by his power, 12 so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Is. 61:2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;

Matt. 5:16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.
