10-171-53 NOW CONCERNING THE LORD'S COMING (RSV)

- :25 2 Thessalonians 2:1 Teaching on the second coming of the Lord. Reference Isaiah 61:2 We live in the age of Grace that time between the Lord's first coming and his second coming. The second coming is not a fringe issue, it is at the heart of our belief. There is more scriptural reference the Christ's second coming than there is to his first coming.
- 5:30 2 Thessalonians 2:1-2 Reading. Paul responds to the Thessalonians to clear up any misunderstanding of the second coming. Teaching.
- 7:45 1 Thessalonians 5:1-2 The Lord will come like a thief in the night. Reference 2 Peter 3:10 The day of the Lord will come like a thief....
- 9:00 Matthew 24:36 But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. Reference Matthew 24:42-44 The Lord's return will be a time not expected. Reference 1 Thessalonians 5:4 Reference Matthew 24:32-33.
- 12:00 Matthew 24:44 Therefore you also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect.
- 12:25 2 Thessalonians 2:1-3 What will precede the second coming? A massive turning away from God, by the world and the church. The man of lawlessness. Teaching.

- 17:00 2 Timothy 3:1-5 A partial description of the last days. Teaching.
- 21:00 2 Thessalonians 1:6-10 Judgment will prevail at the last day. Reference 2 Peter 3:3-10 The Lord has delayed his judgment so that there is more time for repentance.
- 24:40 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Paul answers their questions about what happens to those who have already died before the second coming.
- 27:10 1 Thessalonians 2:19-20 What love gift will we give the Lord at his coming? Not a salvation matter to gain God's favor, just a gift of returned love. Reference 1 Corinthians 3:12-15 We need to build enduring things upon God's one foundation.

- <u>2Th. 2:1</u> Now concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our assembling to meet him, we beg you, brethren, <u>2</u> not to be quickly shaken in mind or excited, either by spirit or by word, or by letter purporting to be from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord has come.
- <u>Is. 61:2</u> to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;
- <u>1Th. 5:1</u> But as to the times and the seasons, brethren, you have no need to have anything written to you. $\underline{2}$ For you yourselves know well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night.
- <u>2Pet. 3:10</u> But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and the works that are upon it will be burned up.
- Matt. 24:36 "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only.
- Matt. 24:42 Watch therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. 43 But know this, that if the householder had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have watched and would not have let his house be broken into. 44 Therefore you also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect.
- Matt. 24:32 "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. 33 So also, when you see all these things, you know that he is near, at the very gates.
- 2Th. 2:1 Now concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our assembling to meet him, we beg you, brethren, 2 not to be quickly shaken in mind or excited, either by spirit or by word, or by letter purporting to be from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord has come. 3 Let no one deceive you in any way; for that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of perdition,
- <u>2Tim. 3:1</u> But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of stress. 2 For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant,

abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, $\underline{3}$ inhuman, implacable, slanderers, profligates, fierce, haters of good, $\underline{4}$ treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, $\underline{5}$ holding the form of religion but denying the power of it. Avoid such people.

2Th. 1:6 since indeed God deems it just to repay with affliction those who afflict you, 7 and to grant rest with us to you who are afflicted, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in flaming fire, 8 inflicting vengeance upon those who do not know God and upon those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. 9 They shall suffer the punishment of eternal destruction and exclusion from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might, 10 when he comes on that day to be glorified in his saints, and to be marveled at in all who have believed, because our testimony to you was believed.

<u>2Pet. 3:3</u> First of all you must understand this, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own passions <u>4</u> and saying, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things have continued as they were from the beginning of creation." <u>5</u> They deliberately ignore this fact, that by the word of God heavens existed long ago, and an earth formed out of water and by means of water, <u>6</u> through which the world that then existed was deluged with water and perished. <u>7</u> But by the same word the heavens and earth that now exist have been stored up for fire, being kept until the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men.

<u>2Pet. 3:8</u> But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. <u>9</u> The Lord is not slow about his promise as some count slowness, but is forbearing toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. <u>10</u> But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and the works that are upon it will be burned up.

<u>1Th. 4:13</u> But we would not have you ignorant, brethren, concerning those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. <u>14</u> For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. <u>15</u> For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the

coming of the Lord, shall not precede those who have fallen asleep. <u>16</u> For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the archangel's call, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first; <u>17</u> then we who are alive, who are left, shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air; and so we shall always be with the Lord. <u>18</u> Therefore comfort one another with these words.

1Th. 2:19 For what is our hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at his coming? Is it not you? 20 For you are our glory and joy.

 $\underline{1\text{Cor. }3:12}$ Now if any one builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw — $\underline{13}$ each man's work will become manifest; for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. $\underline{14}$ If the work which any man has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward. $\underline{15}$ If any man's work is burned up, he will suffer loss, though he himself will be saved, but only as through fire.
